STRIKE MOVEMENT IN WISCONSIN AND IOWA LOSES FORCE

Milk Producers' Association And Law and Order Group Back President in Program to Aid Agriculture

By THOMAS F. HAWKINS (Associated Press Staff Writer) Disaffection spread in the ranks of farm strikers yesterday, and the movement to "without produce" to "without produce" apparently was declining in its stronghold—two western Iowa towns and Wisconsin.

The "Slow-Down-Down" Milk Producers' association wired President Roosevelt yesterday, asking him to sign a program to aid agriculture, and assured him that "there will be no strike in this area."

The Farmers' Holiday association, sponsor of the 20-day strike, had requested the association to join the National League of American Women in a four-day strike for food production prices for farm products.

A wire to President Roosevelt also was dispatched by H. W. Brown, president of Plymouth county farmers, and Order League to oppose the strike.

His telegram read: "The Plymouth County Iowa Law and Order League is in a state of readiness to volunteer aid to restore agriculture to normal. We realize you have a job to do."

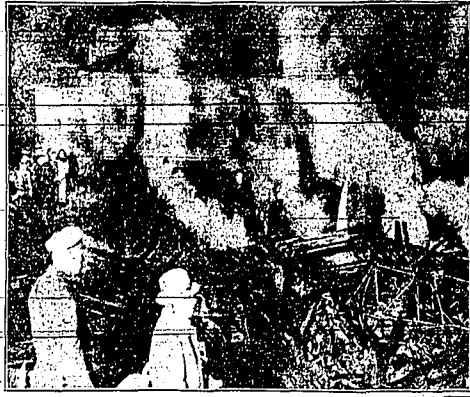

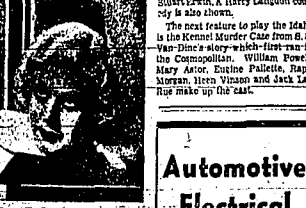
