PINCHOT FOR STATE LIQUOR DISPENSARY

Pennsylvania Governor Asks Legislature for Control of Traffic and Revenues

HARRISBURG, Pa., Nov. 13.—Gov. Pinchot today asked the legislature in special session, to control the liquor through state operated stores and to apply the profits to unemployment relief, assistance to schools and old age assistance.

The governor outlined a tax of 25 cents a gallon on all liquor manufactured and sold in this state in immediately \$5,000,000 and that a 10-cent return must be paid. The return would give the state \$25,000,000 annually.

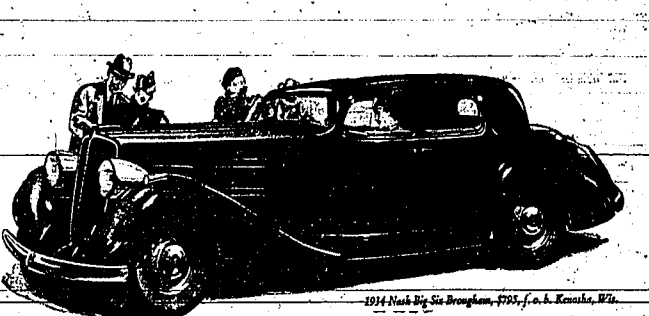

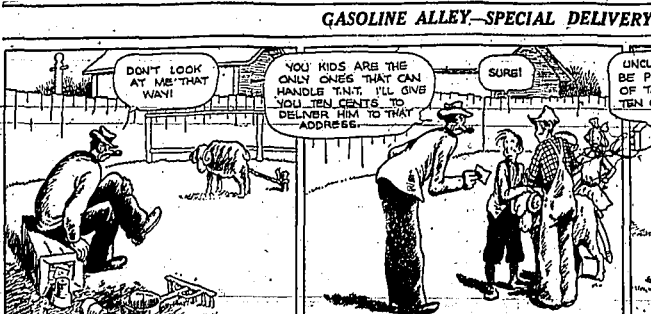

COMMODITY PRICE LEVEL

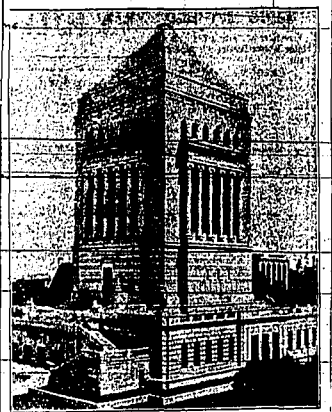

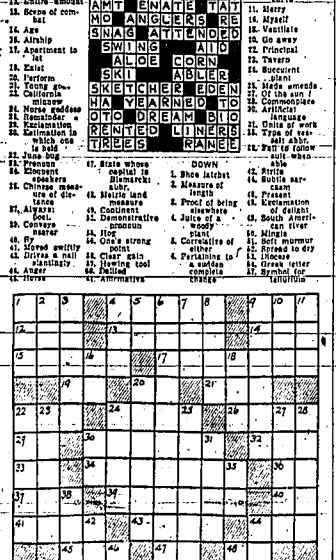

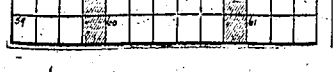
