TABER, RE-ELECTED LEADER OF CHANGERS, PROMISES TO FIGHT

Leader Begins Eleventh Year At Head of Organization With Plan to Battle for Improvement of Farm

(By The Associated Press) COLUMBUS, Ohio, Nov. 20. (AP) — Taber was elected today as leader of the National Farm Bureau of the sixth successive two-year term and immediately promised to open "battle" to protect and promote the interests of the American farmer.

Announced last chosen for the 1934 national convention, he was elected with 56,000 votes, the highest total for any candidate in the history of the organization and conferred only during national conventions.

Mrs. Arthur A. Starnes of Portsmouth, Rhode Island, was elected officer, the highest position for women in the organization for two years.

Who the voters who received votes was not made known, but it is not believed that more than 200,000 members were voting in each state since neither writing in the person of their choice for each year.

After his election, Master Taber issued a statement declaring "the greatest battle is yet before us in his history to protect and promote the interests of the American farmer."
