JUDGE REFUSES TO ADVISE ACQUITTAL IN GOVERNMENT TRIAL

Defense Cross Examination Of State's Witnesses Curbed During Day's Session of Court at Boise

BOISE, Nov. 23.—Judge C. T. Koozekan, presiding at the trial of John Deery, state's session judge operator, on a charge of kidnapping P. J. Pringle of Twin Falls, today refused to advise acquittal, and during the action, curbed defense cross examination of state witnesses and concluded the day by retaining an advisory instruction for acquittal.

Defense attorneys continued their attacks on the credibility of all prosecution witnesses, calling the testimony of certain witnesses in question and attacking the testimony of one who allegedly kidnapped Pringle and hid him for a week for a while in a barn and feigning an effort to forestall a series of farm foreclosures.

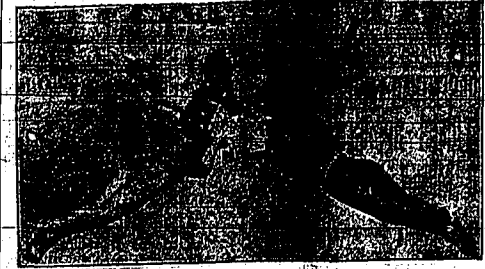

William F. Fox Reviews
Forced Sale in Opera-
tions on Stock Market

WASHINGTON, Nov. 23 (AP)—William Fox, silent motion picture magnate who retired in 1930 when forced to sell control of his vast film and theater holdings, rested off what he called his own "crash" in the 1929 market crash, for senate investigators today and placed in the case former President Hoover and some of the nation's leading bankers.

Speaking rapidly and at times wincing, the bald-headed Fox, who rose to fame from a background of poverty, told a vivid real life story to a audience which filled the banking committee room.

Smoking a cigar and often propping his legs on the desk and spectators, Fox said he was forced "under duress" to sell his companies to General Electric Equipment, Incorporated, in April, 1930, after bankers had "entered a conspiracy" to deny him credit.

Talks With Hoover
He also told of conversations with President Hoover and other Republican leaders early in 1929 to prevent his prosecution under the anti-trust laws in connection with his acquisition of Loew Theater shares.

"His story was brought in the names of Claudius M. Huston, then chairman of the Republican national committee; Louis B. Mayer, motion picture producer; and Chalmers Francis Hunter, leader at that time and Will H. Hays, movie czar and also a former Republican chairman.

Fox said he obtained the assistance of Huston and Burke in the anti-trust matters that he paid Mayer \$100,000 for claims he had in connection with the Fox-Loew merger, and that before the merger, Mayer was a partner in a company "connected to have had the justice department change its opinion concerning the issue of Loew shares from one of consent to one of restriction."

He named Charles Halsey—Stewart and company; Albert H. Wigton, former trustee of the Chase National bank; John Otiserson, official of the American Telegraph and Telephone company and a bank in New York as "conspirators."

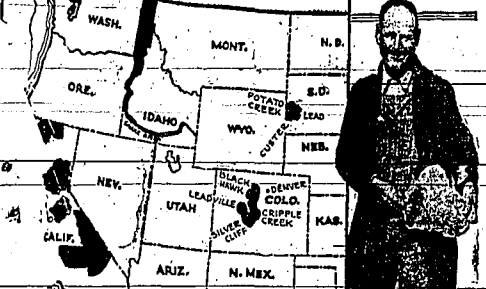

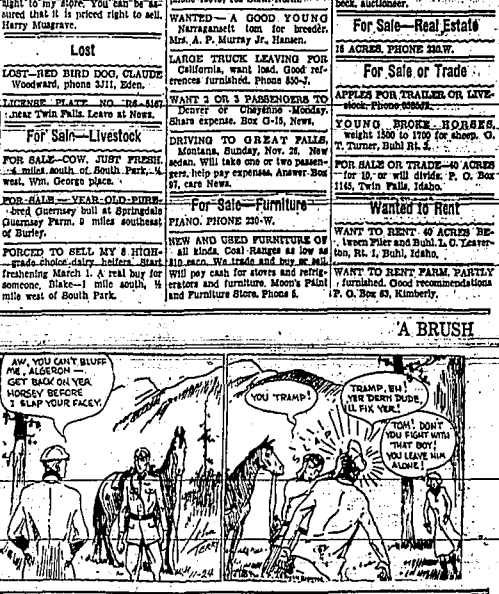
Man Severing Limb Injured When Tree Workmen Saw Tree
