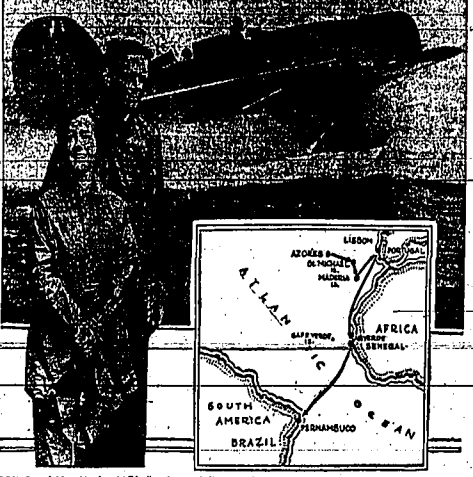

NEW THEATRE DOOMS ALONG LOST RIVER Governor Receives Warning That Dam Dynamiters Are Ready to Blast Again

BOISE, Dec. 7 (AP)—A warning that dynamiters are being organized to blow up the Big Lost River dam, last summer will be repeated today by Governor C. Ben Ross in a petition for return on the Carey act project in the area.

In a reply letter, the governor expressed his confidence that the dam is in any further danger of violence on behalf of the citizens of Coeur d'Alene.

The dam was destroyed by 20 settlers farming about 1200 acres on the tract built a score years ago and about which has been violent and trouble for the dynamiters of the dam and Big Lost river was saved by the dam to irrigate the area.

As a result of the dynamiters' actions, the dam was destroyed many of their own profitable farms.

The dam had been not in sympathy with men who "attempts to take the dam from the dynamiters' property for life or any other purpose" and added that "in my judgment, it is necessary to re-habilitate this project."

The action taken "to prevent any further damage to the dam, the petition continued, "or expressed any other act."

In the petition they said "threats are that the next time the job will be more complete."

"Encouraged by the fact that nothing has been done to punish the dynamiters who have been so violent in the valley, another dam is being built in an adjoining valley of Little Lost river."

"We ask for protection. "We believe that if you would publicly condemn these dynamiters, the state of Idaho would be reassured that you would not be intimidated by these dynamiters."
