FLOOD CONDITIONS THREATEN THIRTEEN PACIFIC NORTHWEST REGION

Deaths and Injuries Reported As Gales Lash Western Washington and Rainfall Sends Rivers Over Banks

(By The Associated Press) SEATTLE, Dec. 9.—Dangerous flood conditions threatened western Washington today as a series of gales, already believed responsible for 14 deaths and injuries and sent rivers over their banks.

Aberdeen and Hoquiam reported the worst flooding in 20 years, and the streets of the former city were turned into a sea of mud. Citizens went about in small boats. Tumbled rocks, washed out bridges and debris were scattered about the city. Flood water from the Snohomish river inundated the village of Burdett and residents prepared to abandon their homes.

Accidents Result

Heavy rain and high winds were blamed for numerous automobile accidents in the Seattle area today. Killed and several injured.

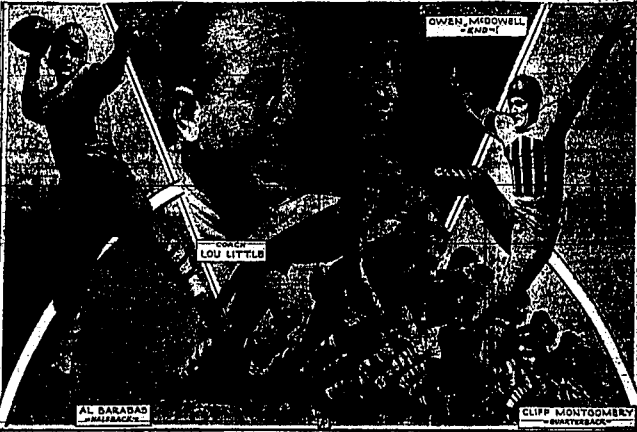

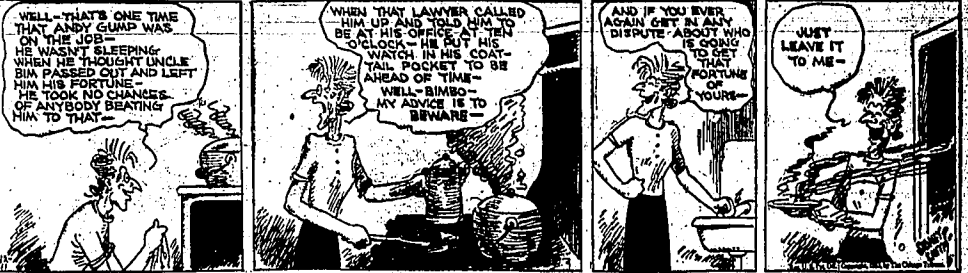

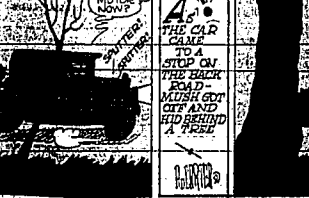
