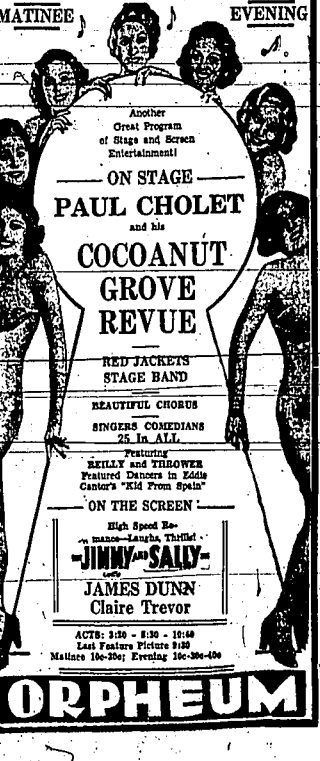

# Mack Sells Grove, Walberg, Bishop, Cochrane, Earnshaw Landis, Baseball's \$40,000 Dictator, Lands New Seven-Year Contract

## Veteran Boss of A's Wrecks Team In \$300,000 Deal

Financial Pressure, Forced By Philadelphia Bankers, Assigned as Reason for Sales of Great Players

CHICAGO, Dec. 12.—(C) Connie Mack, veteran leader of the Philadelphia Athletics who startled baseball world back in 1914 by breaking up his famous "\$100,000 infield," tonight went even further by selling pitchers "lefty" Grove and catcher Walberg and infielder Max Bishop to the Boston Red Sox, Mickey Cochrane to the Detroit Tigers and pitcher George Earnshaw to the Chicago White Sox.

The deal, involving an estimated \$300,000, was announced today for the first time, but not announced until tonight at the announcement of the major league in Chicago.

Only Fox Remains  
Philadelphia bankers were assigned as the reason for the sale, some of the most important in the history of baseball. The deal will complete a break-up of the famous infield team that won the world championship in 1929 and '30. Only Jimmy Fox, champion batsman and home run king, remains of the outstanding baseball troupe.

Mack reportedly said as he announced the deal, refused to reveal the cash terms, but announced that the Athletics had obtained Harold Warlick, shortstop, and pitcher Bob Kline from the Red Sox and catcher Charlie Berry from the White Sox. Detroit gave up catcher Johnny Papp, released last summer by the Tigers from Beaumont, of the Texas league, but he, in turn, was sent to the White Sox who were given a pitcher to make up for the loss of Berry.

Playing Manager  
Cochrane, 36, reported to cash sum of \$100,000 will manage the Tigers in 1936 as a playing pilot, but was to be in charge of the club's acquisition was revealed.

In the absence of a definite announcement, it was reported that Mack could be gained on the cash involved in the expected but important deal, but undoubtedly he will have new life and hope in the heroes of top-heavy American league race.

Forced To Sell  
There was no secret among club owners that Mack and his Philadelphia associates were forced to sell their team to raise money and the announcement was held until after the Sunday baseball game was made in Pennsylvania. Also it was reported that Mack had sold the White Sox gave \$250,000 in cash and catcher Berry for Earnshaw.

Seniors and Sophomores  
The break-up of the great Athletics team of modern day baseball started when Mack sold out his Philadelphia Athletics to the Boston Red Sox and infielder Jimmy Dykes to the White Sox.
