HOME CHRISTMAS FOR HOOPER FAMILY

Former President and Wife Make Festive Preparations for Yuletide

By KATHERINE BEENE (Associated Press Staff Writer) STANFORD UNIVERSITY, Dec. 20.—The first time in several years the Herbert Hoopers will spend Christmas in their own home here. The big gray-stone house on San Juan hill, which has seen but little of its traveled owners since it was built on the Stanford University campus soon after the war, is abuzz with festive preparations, like other homes of the land. The yuletide board will see an old-fashioned Yuletide reunion about the Christmas tree to be held by a former president.

The Herbert Hoopers Jr., with their three children, are expected here on Friday from their Southern California home in Sierra Madre, where former Hoover is connected with an aviation company, Allan, the younger son, will come Saturday from Princeton. It has not yet been known from his work in a bank there.

Christmas cards, too, are going out this year to friends for the first time since 1917, after the four-year "White House" lapse in accordance with long-established custom that the president sends only reciprocal, official greetings, the number rapidly approaching 1,000, including mail groves sent each day as Christmas cards from all parts of the world.

WORK RESUMES ON ROGERSON HIGHWAY

Re-Employment Office Calls For 20 Men and 30 Teams To Start Operations

Twenty men and 30 teams will be put to work this morning on grading and graveling of road extending eastward from Rogerson toward Shoshone Basin, a project being taken up by the county civil works committee after it had been abandoned by a regular set-up consisting of the federal relief administration, state highway department and Twin Falls highway district.

Residents of the vicinity of Rogerson and Amsterdam have for the most part been assigned to this project, and workers were sent to them yesterday afternoon. Work was resumed from the county civil works committee, which is supervising national re-employment office manager, said last evening.

The work scale is to be 35 cents an hour for a 28-hour week.

The Rogerson road project, which completes the county civil works program which was assigned last week by authorization for employment of 210 men, bringing the total for this county up to 323 men.

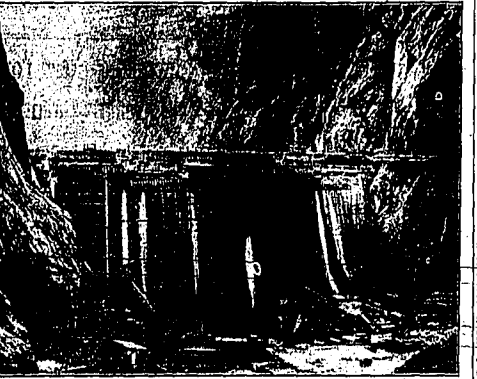
