(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Dec. 28.—Congressional leaders today declared themselves against recovery-unking efforts and promised President Roosevelt a "short, business-like session" and "everything fine."

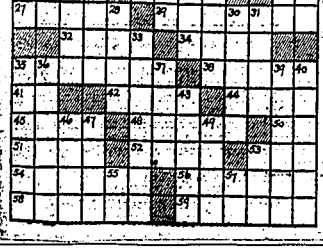

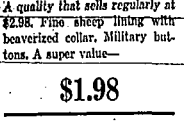

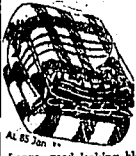
