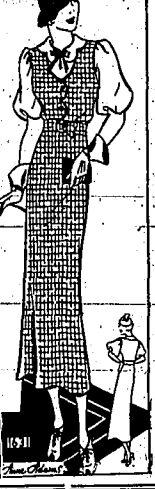

He rode the pony express between St. Joseph, Missouri, and Silver City, Idaho, and drove stage between Washington and Oregon in 1861. He was born in Anderson county, Missouri. Five children survive.

ARGENTINE TROOPS CLASH WITH REBELS

Presidency Claims Conditions Normal After Bloody Battle

BUENOS AIRES, Dec. 30 (AP)—A communique from the presidency tonight said 400 radical rebels were killed and more than 30 wounded in a battle last night between loyal Argentine troops and more than 300 rebels who crossed into Corrientes province, Argentina, from Brazil. While the government claimed normal conditions returned to the country today, last night's battle was apparently a final step-up in the assassination of Premier Jose G. Suarez, President Justo blamed the radical party.

The presidential communique added that the Corrientes revolution, among whom it was named numerous Brazilians, were being returned to the United States for trial by the Argentine army. The communique said: "After clashing with border forces, the rebels tried to invade the town of Paso de los Libres but were repulsed by the Argentine army."

A smaller group of rebels was reported to have captured the border town of Estacion in the same province, and loyal troops were said to be preparing to recapture the position. A state of siege, invoked shortly after rebels tried to invade Corrientes, was still in effect but authorities assured the nation that there were no further acts of insubordination.

One hundred thirty radical leaders were held aboard a river boat 230 miles north of here off Santa Fe city where they were meeting when they were captured. It was considered likely they will be returned here for investigation.

In a manifesto President Justo scored the radicals for retaining to enter the March elections despite guarantees of amnesty and declared as "treasonable" their refusal to help restore political equilibrium after the 1930 revolution.

The leaders' demand not to participate in the elections, in which they said they feared fraud, fanned old disorders in which 30 persons were killed, scores were injured, and several hundred were arrested.

RUMANIA DECLARES RIGID MARTIAL LAW

Censorship Invoked to Curtail Aftermath of Premier Assassination

BUCHAREST, Rumania, Dec. 30 (AP)—A decree invoking martial law and rigid newspaper censorship was promulgated tonight as the government prepared for relentless action against any violent aftermath of the assassination of Premier Ion G. Duca, and an attempt on the slayer's life. The entire country was made subject to the martial law order effective at midnight, and military surveillance was provided for throughout the royal palace at Constantine Avram, Duca's residence, would have a free hand in pulling the anti-sensitization from the party.

The body of the slain Liberal leader was brought here from Cluj, a town where he was killed yesterday, by an Iron Guard adherent, after an explosion in the royal parking at Cluj killed seven mourners at the railroad station into a panic and injured one child slightly.

Shortly afterward Radu Polla, the brother-in-law of the late premier, was arrested for his part in the assassination, and a pistol and first-aid kit were found on him. Nicholas Constantinescu, 61, did not hit him.

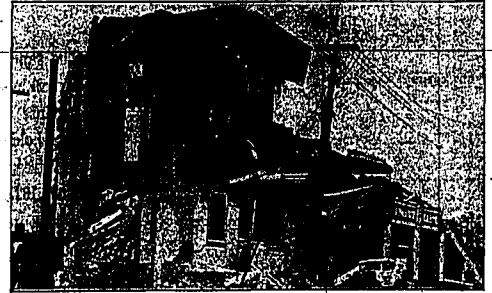

Summing Up Year's Big News

Featured on this page are the big news stories which captured your interest in 1933. Summarized briefly, they are:

ROOSEVELT AND THE "NEW DEAL"—In United States the most outstanding news of 1933 came in with President Roosevelt. His promised "new deal" consisted of a vast recovery program embracing banking reforms, a new monetary policy, the NRA, construction work, the Civilian Conservation Corps, relief for farmers and home owners, and a variety of other measures.

COOLIDGE'S DEATH—The year scarcely had begun when ex-President Calvin Coolidge died suddenly at Northampton, Massachusetts.

ATTEMPTED ASSASSINATION OF ROOSEVELT—Returning from a sea voyage, Franklin D. Roosevelt, then President-elect, was fired on by Giuseppe Zangara at Miami, Florida. Mayor Anton Cermak was fatally wounded and Zangara later was executed for the crime.

AKRON DISASTER—While on a training cruise off the New Jersey coast, the navy's great strafe, the Akron, fell into the sea during a storm, carrying 74 men to their death.

CALIFORNIA EARTHQUAKE—Among the major disasters in the United States in 1933 was the devastating earthquake in southern California, which took approximately 120 lives.

THE WAR ON KIDNAPERS—Kidnaping suddenly became less popular when federal officers and public opinion mobilized against them. As a climax to the federal drive, during which several notorious criminals were imprisoned for their capture at San Jose, California, the single handed effort of Wiley Post, Oklahoma pilot, who while enroute to Chicago, Cuba, experienced a period of static and bloodshed that brought the unseating of President Gerardo Machado and his successor, Dr. C. M. de Cespedes.

NEWS FROM FOREIGN LANDS—The biggest foreign news came from Germany when Adolf Hitler ascended to power as the country's dictator. The sweeping changes of the new regime furnished topics for discussion around the world. From Soviet Russia to Washington came general Maxim Litvinoff, whose conversations with President Roosevelt led to the recognition of Russia, thereby ending a diplomatic breach of 13 years. Cuba experienced a period of static and bloodshed that brought the unseating of President Gerardo Machado and his successor, Dr. C. M. de Cespedes.

REPEAL—The Eighteenth amendment after 13 years of life was erased from the constitution when the states were again given the opportunity to vote on the controversial question.

HISTORY-MAKING FEATS OF AVIATION—Big things were accomplished by aviators in 1933. Probably the most spectacular was the single handed effort of Wiley Post, Oklahoma pilot, who while enroute to Chicago, Cuba, made a round trip flight from Italy to Chicago. The Lindberghs took the air for a survey of the northern air routes and extended it into a five-month trip through Europe and back across the South Atlantic to South America before they returned home.

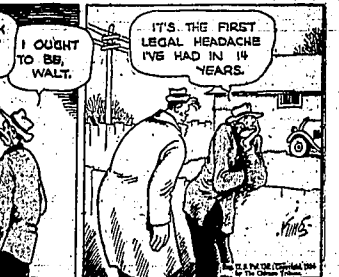
