Police Chief Frank Culp, who braved the murderous fire armed only with a pistol, was shot in the lungs and is expected to recover. "Wounds of the other three were minor."

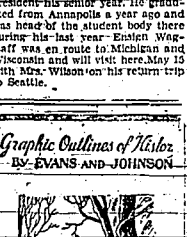
