



#### PACIFIC CHESS

The Pacific chess game is largely naval.

Ordering the powerful Pacific fleet into the Atlantic. son the Atlantic, some weeks ago, was a gesture widely interpreted to mean that the United States fell no menure in that innotes. Janan's response was to prepare for new aggression against China. Announcement of her protectorate over China came almost at the moment when our fleet was being moved through the Panama Canal. Japan obviously felt freer

-All this action may look belligerent. Americans are not really belligerent at all. But this seems to be the only sort of language understood by militarists in Tokyo.

#### SILVER STATUS IMPROVES

Advocates of the colunge of silver for monetary use may take heart from the re-cent dvelopments in government circles in respect of the use of the white metal. President Roosevelt Is said to have altered his views at least in part with the result that silver advocates close to the center of things beginning to predict a silver program guaranteed price sufficient to permit of the mining of silver upon a basis which will show a profit instead of a loss.

There would seem to be no good reason why such a program would not work out to good advantage especially throughout the western silver mining area. It may never become advisable to return the entire distance to the status of silver prior to eighteen hundred seventy-three but it is difficult to perceive wherein any great harm would result from a definitly fixed price sufficiently high to ren der silver mining profitable.

As a matter of fact this plan was in effect or some time during the middle twenties during which period-mined silver commanded a price of one dollar an ounce payable in gold or gold notes. There were no embarrassing features of any kind and there was a very definite rehabilitation of the business of silver mining in Idaho and throughout the entire West.

#### CORN AGAIN

The AAA is up against a tough problem. and acknowledges the corn. It holds 260,which the government has lent 45 cents a bushel. If the farmers sold at present prices and repaid the loans, they wouldn't have anything for their corn. They probledy won't pay. Then they won't have anything for their corn, either; but what will Uncle Sam do with it if he forecloses?

The farmers have nearly 600,000,000 bushels more, not earmarked for the AAA. With it they can feed their pigs till the new harvest. But the pigs are the real problem. Pigs are merely digested corn. And "pig is pigs" more than ever. No race suicide there, and no loss of appetite. What on earth is a pigminded government going to do, with all that nork coming on to cram an already overfonded market? Bölling up the little pige for grease and soap, is unpopular. Any-kind of food destruction looks bad, when there is still much privation. Anyone with a wise solution will be thanked for it by the AAA.

Some say, burn the corn. This suggestion is not so destructive as it sounds. Corn in the ear is good fuel for a stove or furnace, and might thus realize half its market value us a foodstuff. Large quantities of cornmeal might be distributed for relief. We might ship corn to China, in exchange for sliver, turquoise and crystal goblets, if Japan vould let uit.

ON THE RIGHT TRACK
