Auxiliary Backs Legion in Legislation for Disabled Veterans

Legislative activities of the American Legion Auxiliary are outlined by Mrs. Louis P. Leopold, chairman of the legislative committee of the article. One of the most important legislative measures ever endorsed by the American Legion Auxiliary is the four-point plan by which the Legion will endeavor to win back for the disabled veterans what they lost through the Economy Act.

The legislative committee's duty is to provide the passage of Legion-sponsored legislation. When important measures, favored or opposed by the Legion and Auxiliary, are being taken to take the action desired.

It is also the duty of each legislative chairman to win the support of the entire community to the Legion's and Auxiliary's position, presenting the question involved to the other women's organizations of the community and urging them also to communicate with the legislative representatives in regard to the measure.

The four-point program on which the Legion and Auxiliary is concentrating at the present time, provides:

That no war veteran disabled in line of duty suffer any reduction of those benefits granted such veterans in the World War Veterans' Act as in effect prior to March 20, 1933.

That hospitalization under Federal Government auspices be afforded all veterans not dishonorably discharged who require hospital treatment and who are not able to receive necessary hospital treatment.

That perpetuation of service connection for all veterans properly granted such service connection under laws in existence prior to March 20, 1933, be recommended as an item of legislation.

That the benefits provided for dependents of veterans as established in the World War Veterans' Act be retained and maintained as the Government policy and that in no event shall widows or dependent children of deceased war veterans be without government protection.

FINANCE CORPORATION DENIES RECEIVER'S CLAIM

Pacific Finance corporation of California, with headquarters in Salt Lake City, started suit in the district court here yesterday to require C. D. Thompson, receiver for the First National bank of Twin Falls, to pay \$1,193.33 plus interest on account of five checks which the bank marked paid on December 3, 1931, the day before it closed.

"The checks, according to the finance corporation's complaint, were forwarded to Salt Lake City by the Union Motor company, Twin Falls, and delivered by the finance corporation to the Salt Lake City branch of the Federal reserve bank for collection on December 3. The checks were mailed by the reserve bank to Twin Falls the same day and delivered here December 3, and returned to Salt Lake City the morning of December 4, when the reserve bank refused to pay the finance corporation.

The finance company, represented in this action by J. F. Bottwell and Harry Povey, Twin Falls attorneys, alleges that the First National bank, before it closed, paid the checks and deducted a corresponding amount from the Union Motor company's credit. It argues further that the receiver is not justified in holding this money as a part of the closed bank's assets, but that this money constitutes a trust fund.
