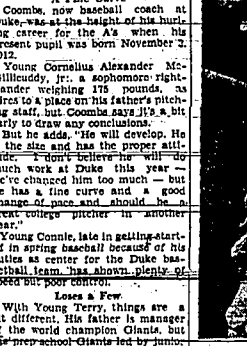

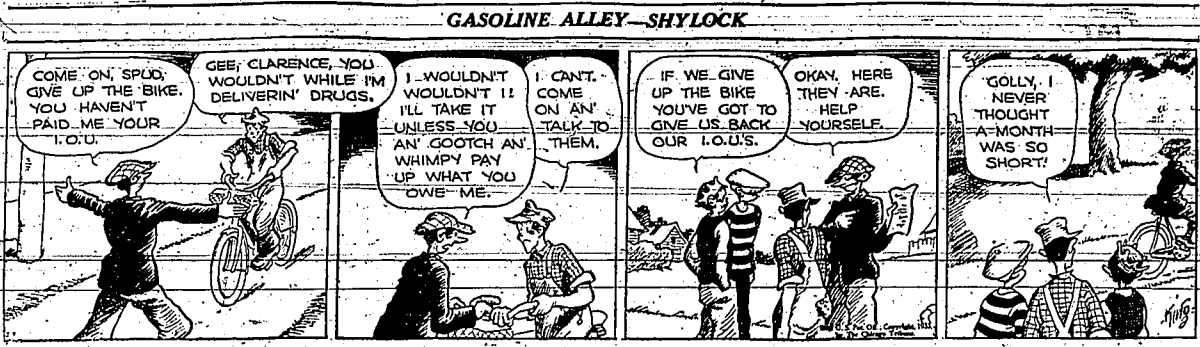

Whitte, to the effect that Coppinger under the influence of liquor attacked E. F. Whitte without provocation and kicked him on the head after refusing him unseasonable attention.

Coppinger pleaded guilty to the disturbance charge and was sentenced by Probate Judge Guy Kimberly on Monday to serve a 30-day term in the county jail.

Babcock yesterday after being sentenced to be committed until 21 years of age to the state industrial training school, W. O. Pezoldt, complaining witness, signed a petition for the parole.

George Frey, accused of forcery of a \$17.30 check with intent to defraud a local department store, pleaded guilty yesterday and announced sentence will be pronounced next Thursday.
