APPOINTMENT OF RELIEF MONEY DISTRICT ATTACKED

Dissatisfaction Expressed in Two Quarters, Twin Falls Meeting Asks "at Least Twice" Sum of \$250,000

Disatisfaction over appointment of federal relief funds to Idaho and the Twin Falls district broke out in two quarters here yesterday.

\$150,000 Allotment Associated Press dispatch from Boise last evening said Idaho received yesterday an allotment of \$350,000 of relief funds for June, the same amount used in less than 10 days during April and they had to be augmented to carry the state's "heavy" during May.

The state had requested a greater amount for June, the allotment was said, and presented a registration list of 86,000 persons requiring relief in "all relief agencies for assistance."

Temperatures at Reno, approximately 59 in the middle of the day, and 54 in the morning, were the highest recorded on the eastern coast.

TOKYO, May 29 (Wednesday) - Admiral Marquis Heihachiro Togo, the silent little man whose destruction of the Tsar's Russian fleet 20 years and three days ago placed Japan among the great powers, died today.

At the age of 84 and with thousands of Japanese's greatest hero, he succumbed at 4:35 p. m. to cancer of the throat.

Admiral Togo was the last and most illustrious of all the heroes of the Russo-Japanese war.

It is taken for granted in Tokyo that he will be canonized according to the Shinto faith.

Agents Looking For Dillinger's 'Grave' In Southern Indiana

CHICAGO, May 29 (P) - Now comes Melvin H. Purvis, head of the local bureau of the federal department of investigation to add his opinion to that of those expressing the opinion that John Dillinger is dead.

He is 40 or so age Attorney General Homer S. Cummings murmured "I wonder if Dillinger isn't dead."

But Purvis said that he had seen four girl companions of Dillinger gangsters reportedly were questioned about the mob's activities.
