



AN OUTSTANDING FIGURE

A stalwart old war horse of public affairs is removed from the scene of earthly activi-ties in the death of Charles S. Thomas of Denver, one time governor of Colorado and later for two terms United States Senator.

Senator Thomas will always be rebered as a clever and resourceful politician but he was more than that A life long Damo crat he never hesitated to oppose his party when in his judgment the party program was not best calculated to serve public interests. He served in the United States Senate under President Wilson and he fought early and late during most of his two terms against both League of Nations and the Versailles Treaty. Similarly, he was an advocate of the free coinage of silver at a time when his party to a man would have none of it. Within the past year he espoused a principle of pri-vate property rights which led him to deliberately acquire a quantity of gold in excess of erately acquire a quantity of gold in excess of:
the amount allowed to be retained by Presidential decree and wired his government to
the effect that he "had qualified for the
penitentiary and am at your service." His
"hoard" consisted of gold to the value of one
hundred and twenty dollars and the incident
was passed over by Federal authorities.
He was an advocate of the open shop and

branded labor unions as a negation of in-dividual liberty and the end of independen citizenship. So sharply outspoken was he in his-opposition-to-Soldiers' Bonus-legislationthat the Colorado American Legion invited him to move his residence to "a certain place in Holland." His attitude towards his colleagues at the capital is summed up in an expression employed in a speech at Denver upon his return from the Senate: "Frankly," he said, "I must say that I have not a very high opinion of the sincerity of the representatives of the people in Washington. With few exventions they are mostly interested in wha they think will please their constitutionts without much regard for the nation's best interests.

His independence of thought was apparent throughout his entire career as a practicing attorney and at times was carried to ex-treme lengths. His sincerity and honesty of purpose however were among his butstanding characteristics and because of these qualities he commanded a following of consequence in every movement with which he identified himself.

Senator Thomas was distinctly an standing type and during his active years he built for himself a place in the history of Colorado unique in public life. Whether we agree or differ with him it would seem that public life, Whether we his contribution to current progress was distinctly noteworthy.

CANADIAN LIBERALISM

At a time when most of the world seems to be turning conservative, Canada suddenly swings to the left. In Ontario, the biggest and most populous province, a conservative party which has ruled steadily for 29 years is swept out of power. The conservatives meet a similar fate in Saskatchewan, a farm province. All the provincial governments have now, gone liberal. It seems fair to assume that a national election now would swing the conservative national government to liberalism.

Americans will naturally interpret the shift as in harmony with political changes on this side of the border, and more or less caused by them. It is natural that a country bound to ours so closely in its economic life should show similar tendencies politically. Canada is, of course, a loyal member of the

British Empire, but on its bread-and-butter to the United States more closely than to England, Industries, morce finance manner of life, all are inter

An interesting possibility comes to mind, as we look back to Canada's last great poli-tical overturn. The Dominion went conservative largely on the trade reciprocity issue submitted by President Taft, turning down a treaty negotiated by him. There have been signs lately that Canadian sentiment is change ing in this regard. Our own government has come back to the same old idea, and the President is empowered to make reciprocal tariff readjustments with any nation.

If Canada goes reciprocal now, she may

become once more our best foreign customer, to the advantage of North American business generally.
