CLOUD SAILING

"I used clouds almost altogether, making use of but one hill during the whole flight said Richard, C. du Pont, describing his record flight from Elmira, N. Y., to Somerset Hills, N. J., in a motorless plane. He covered a distance of 155 miles, achieving an altitude of 3,000 feet, and gliding for a total of five hours and 50 minutes.

More than 46 gliders went up on the first

day of the annual meet of the Souring Society America, Most of them were up only a few minutes. Three only tried for distance, Two of these went 25 and 30 miles. Young du Pont, with his 165 miles, established a new world record.

Soaring in a motorless plane is a matter of riding on air currents. The art of using clouds, as du Pont did, is described by the New York Times:

"As the cloud hides the sun, the air cools beneath it and tends to drop, pushing upward the warm-nin-it has displaced near the sun-warm-de earth. The greater rush of up currents thus generated is usually found along the front edge of a moving cloud. Mr. du Pont found those currents hugging the fronts of clouds until he could climb no further. Then beginning to lose altitude, he would dire for another. Once when there was no helping cloud in sight, the

pilot found an hir current, one whose course upward was caused by a moun-

tain. He rode that to the crest and over, then hooked on to another cloud."




