

NEARING DEADLINE SPURS CANDIDATES

Lists of Aspirants for
Congress, Bench, State
Offices Increase

HOUSE, July 12 (AP)—With only 48 hours remaining before the filing deadline Saturday at 5 p. m., two candidates for congress and one for state judge office, and one for district judge office, nomination today at the office of secretary of state.

Lewis Williams of Boise, Congressman Compton I. White of Clark, R. F. Pait of Blackfoot, R. E. Thomas of Orofino, E. J. Soelberg of Rexburg and B. A. McDewitt of Pocatello formally entered the primaries.

L. M. Lampert of Boise, Republican aspirant for Second district congress, took out nomination blanks.

Williams, seeking the Democratic nomination for Second district congress, recently resigned from the office of commissioner of public welfare, effective next January 1st, in one of the most crowded primary fields.

Congressman White, a Democrat, seeks reelection to a second term in congress.

Seek State Offices

Thomas, former state prison warden, aspires to the Republican nomination to the office of secretary of state. He will be opposed in the primary by Arthur C. Dunn of Burley and Oscar E. Halsey of St. Maries.

Soelberg, another Republican, under the party's generosity, will be opposed in the primary by Tom Peeney of Moscow.

Pait will enter the Republican primary for governor. His opponents are J. Wesley Holden of Idaho Falls and Frank L. Stephen of Twin Falls, both of whom have filed.

McDewitt seeks the Fifth district bench nomination in the non-partisan judiciary primary.

Halsey, former state official, filed nominations yesterday.

G. Walter Lawrence of Pocatello submitted petitions for the Democratic nomination for secretary of state.

D. Worth Clark of Pocatello, formerly assistant attorney general, filed petitions for the Democratic nomination for Second district congress.

Turner K. Hackman of Twin Falls, Republican candidate for the Second congressional nomination, filed all signatures from 11 counties.

Sam Blaine of Boise, former assistant attorney general filed petitions for election to the supreme court bench.

E. M. Wolfe of Twin Falls and C. W. Soelberg of Idaho Falls filed for district judgeship.

RETIRED MERCHANT DIES AT KIMBERLY

Funeral Services Will Be
Conducted Saturday for
George L. Noble

KIMBERLY, July 12 (Special to The News)—George L. Noble, 70, pioneer merchant and landowner, died at his home here at 8:15 a. m. today. He succumbed to angina pectoris, a disease of the heart with which he had been seriously ill for the past three days.

Mr. Noble was born in West Union, Iowa, September 15, 1863. He was in the merchandising business for a number of years in Algona, Iowa, and Newport, Washington, before he came to Kimberly, where he has made his home for the past 20 years. During the years 1913 to 1920 he was owner of a mercantile store here, and in 1930 he retired.

His body lies at the White mortuary, Twin Falls. Funeral arrangements were completed this afternoon after the arrival of his sister, Mrs. C. S. McMartin, who came by plane from Phoenix, Arizona.

Funeral services will be held Saturday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock at the Methodist church at Kimberly with Rev. George O. Roseberry conducting the services and Rev. Raymond, former pastor of the Kimberly Christian church, assisting.

Following funeral services the body will be taken to West Union, Iowa, accompanied by Mrs. Noble, whose interment will be conducted at the family plot. Mr. Noble is survived by his wife, Mrs. Noble; his sister, Mrs. C. S. McMartin; his niece, Mrs. Nelson Price of Phoenix, Mrs. Grace Tibbitt of Cheyenne, Wyoming, and three nephews, John McMartin of New York City, Percy Gorman and Lawrence Gorman, Grand Island, Nebraska.

NEW YORK, July 12—Stocks assumed to end easier tone with commodities today but trading dwindle. Enthusiasm for grains and cotton, whittled up by this week's rally, faded after being after being as much as 3 cents a bushel at one time. Industrial stocks, encumbered by increased offerings as they neared the peaks of the June rally and retreated. While waiting for indications of the late summer business trend, traders were unwilling to touch on either side of the market and prices continued to move in the narrow range. Volume on the stock exchange decreased to 466,929 shares. The Federal Reserve bank announced a 50-cent increase in the rate of 7.5 percent.
