### A GOOD BEGINNING

One of the most hopeful of all the signs of the times in these parts is to be found in the meeting held here Wednesday evening when upwards of fifty men including two or three candidates for office took the fir step in the direction of political rehabilita tion for Twin Falls county.

Republican success in the coming election is the end sought but the point stressed is not so much a Republican victory as such but rather the establishment of a new and better order of things in the matter of county and state government clear down the line.

A number among those present made brief remarks indicating a degree of earnestness and sincerity which should lend a new and better tone to the entire campaign. Loose and extravagant operating methods in gov-ernment must go, say these men, to the end that the steady increase in taxation may cease and actual tax expense be cut down to

a point where taxes may be paid.
Attention was called to the seriousness of
the altuation from the standpoint of the
state as a whole. With a population of only a little over four hundred thousand peop Idaho pays a total per capita tax today which will inevitably lead to state wide bankruptcy if indeed it is paid at all. As matters now stand tax delinquincles have been cut down but no effort whatever has been made to cui public expenses in the county and an under-standing of the fact that such a situation affects not only the direct taxpayer but every man, woman and child in the county is gradually gaining ground.

The spirit manifested by those present at The spirit manifested by those present at the meeting should serve as a spiendid intro-duction to the serious work ahead. The matter of national politics is involved only incidentally if at all. The end sought is a better, more economical and more efficient administration of public affairs in the state and it is hoped to select a set of men who will give this for the benefit of Idaho people as a whole without reference to political affiliations or party service.

Such a program should meet with wide

spread approval.

She was devoted to both, and somehow served both with a success rarely equalled.

There was in her life much of what the world regards as self-eacrifice. She shunned personal wealth, turning back into scientific research or devoting to hospitals the money which came to her as a reward for her service to science. She shunned publicity, per-mitting only so much as would help the work close to her heart and setting aside with quiet dignity any that was offered herself.

Medical men have estimated that radium saved 50,000 wounded men from death dur-ing the World War. Other thousands in civil life have been saved from suffering and early death through radium treatment of

-Madame-Curie's passing reminds us of a great personality, often overlooked because of her own modesty and self-effacement. There are courage and inspiration in the example of her life.




