

THE END OF THE CHAPTER

John Dillinger met his fate at the hands of a woman yet during his criminal career women befriended him time and again. One female admirer complains bitterly that "they didn't give him a break." Be it said in passing, he got as much of a break as he gave many times to others. Dillinger may have been a sturdy honest farm boy once. He was a human rat during his later life and his death constitutes a service to society.

Perhaps his nerve is to be admired but even that is open to question. His example is of the kind which makes a strong appeal to certain types and perhaps throughout the country there will be genuine mourning by persons who never saw him but who have built a figure of romance around the man and his story and who are incapable of see-ing clearly just how little there was to admire in the man and his record.

While he lasted he was of enough importance to enlist against himself the services of the Attorney General of the United States but all the notoriety with which he surroundd himself vanished with his death and in the place of a really unique criminal figure there remains a bullet riddled body in a police morgue, a sorrowing father and not very

There is of course the lesson of his example but people will read into it about what they want to. Dillinger proved as many an-other criminal has proved before him that crime does not pay. If the lesson is not entirely lost sight of perhaps the man's life has not been altogether in vain.


