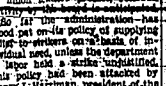

POMONA GRANGERS GATHER AT BURLEY

Water Situation Discussed Freely by Minjodoka and Cassie Farmer

BURLEY, Sept. 3.—Representatives of Minnesota county granges met here today to discuss the water shortage situation at the quarterly session of Cassia county Pomona Grange at DeLoe. Explanation of the effort to secure return of 107,000 acres of water sold by the reclamation department was given by Willard Hayward, chairman of the north side water users committee. It is claimed that this water was the property of the Minidoka project, and was sold without the authorization of the state reclamation department. It is estimated that an amount equal to that disposed of by the government for use of the Minidoka project.

Luke Williams, Minidoka Pomona chapter, A. D. Pierce, chairman of the Cassia county planning board, and others talked on the water situation. A resolution was adopted favoring the diversion of Yellowstone Lake water to the Snake river watershed for use of Idaho irrigators, to be submitted to the Idaho planning board.

Overseer speaks G. A. Meehler, overseer of the Idaho state Grange, gave an address on the value of cooperative buying and selling, and the importance of the operation of a cooperative gasoline company in Ada and Canyon counties. Resolutions were submitted favoring the water situation, favoring the return of part of the reclamation water to the Snake river watershed for use of Idaho irrigators, and asking for the adoption of a modification of the Taylor law which provides for the guaranteeing of land titles by the state.

An entertainment program was directed by Mrs. Saul Clark, lecturer. Clark was selected for the next meeting place. G. A. Ady, master, presided. DeLoe was the attendance banner. During the afternoon entertainment program, Mrs. DeLoe, DeLoe gave a vocal selection, and Mrs. Naomi Finley-DeLoe gave a reading. Cassia Grange and Joe Gishburn, Altoona, were guests of honor. The bridegroom's parents have been informed. They left immediately after the ceremony on a wedding trip, and are expected to arrive in Twin Falls Thursday afternoon. Mrs. M. W. 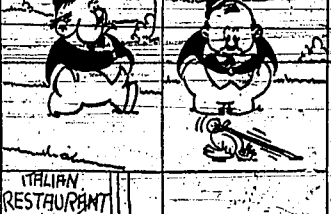

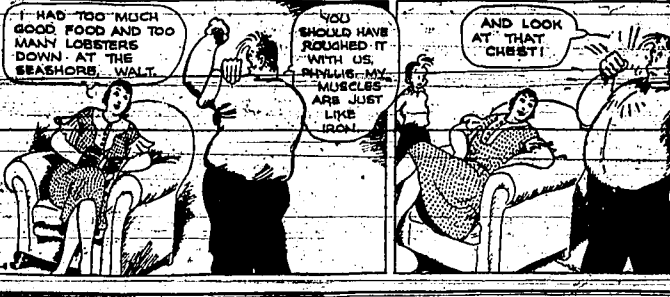
