Testimony Shows England's Ruler and U. S. War Department Aid Makers of Warlike Equipment
WASHINGTON, Sept. 7.—King George V. of England, and the United States war department were portrayed before the senate munitions committee today as competitors in the sale of armaments made of the world.

NOT UTOPIA BUT JOBS. It is evident that people are not so afraid as they were. The fact that all the Utopian schemes get listeners and some of them adherents is proof enough. When a man is in terror he doesn't talk much. When he is ready to argue about pensions and grumble about taxes he is reasonably sure of tomorrow's breakfast.

The second is that for food, clothing, shelter they must pay, one way or another. The third is that there must be balance or smash. The first now seems self-evident, but it was not always so. Centuries of men lived and died believing that it was important whether they themselves were fed, but not important if the man in the next street starved.

The second was long believed. Now people are beginning to think they can get these things from the government without pay. But when they do not pay in honest labor for honest goods, they pay terribly in loss of self-respect, in weakening of the backbone, in deterioration of character. And the taxpayers who are paying in labor are paying twice—once for themselves and once for their neighbors. They cannot advance in comfort and satisfaction because they carry this drag.

The third people forget about. But the man who gives constantly without receiving, whether it be labor without rest or savings without replacement goes to smash sooner or later through exhaustion of himself and his resources. The man who receives all the time without giving goes to smash through rot.

Any schemes which fail to take account of these three fundamentals must fail. The need is not for Utopia but for a plain chance for a plain man to work for a living wage, making things needed by himself and his neighbor.

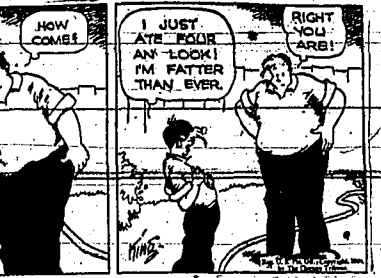
