TEXTILE STRIKERS ORDERED TO SEEK JOBS ONCE MORE

Workers Refused Re-employment To Apply Again as Part of Strategy Move Directed by Union Chiefs

(By The Associated Press) WASHINGTON, Sept. 28.—Textile strikers who have been refused re-employment were ordered today by union chiefs in a strategy move to apply for work again next Monday.

The procedure—a general re-determination of the basis of discrimination complaints filed with the new textile labor board—was adopted by union officers after a long conference with the board.

The latter strongly favor conciliatory methods and attitude in approaching these charges and all other labor disputes with which they must deal.

The speaker quoted the last Democratic national platform as advocating "strengthening and impartial enforcement of the anti-trust laws," and changed that into laws that have been suspended by the NRA.

"In fact it is an open invitation to the employers to discriminate against the workers," he charged.

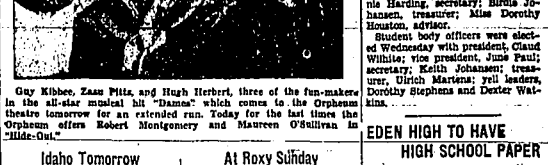
OWYHEE TO VOTE ON COUNTY SEAT MOVE

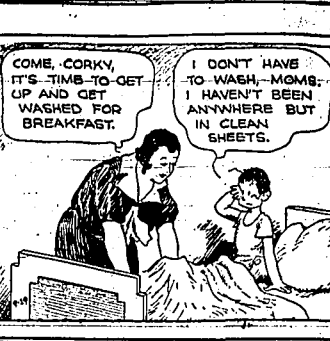
