'Pretty Boy' Floyd's Companion, in Unexpected Move, Arraigned on Two Charges in Ohio City

By The Associated Press. WELLSVILLE, O., Oct. 23.—Missouri and federal officers tonight ended their efforts to obtain custody of Adam Ricchetti, desperado and confederate of the late Charles "Pretty Boy" Floyd.

Ricchetti may be tried for shooting to kill Police Chief J. H. Fultz, of Wellsville, in the same county where Floyd led the band of federal agents and East Liverpool police.

While the authorities argued over the custody of Ricchetti here, Coroner E. B. Suzuki had his pool said he would hold a formal inquest in Floyd's death tomorrow.

BISHOPS LOOK TO YOUTH FOR REFORM

Despair and Hope Mixed in Pastoral Message at Convention Close

ATLANTIC CITY, N. J., Oct. 23 (AP)—With an appeal to youth to check the "evil and lustful ways" of a "wicked and adulterous generation," bishops of the Protestant Episcopal church today addressed a message of mixed despair and hope to the commissioners of their faith.

Massive in full canonicals, the Rt. Rev. James E. Freeman, bishop of Washington, D. C., read the "pastoral" message, the review of church work since the closing of the fifty-first triennial general Episcopal convention.

In contrast to the throng of over 20,000 which gathered October 10 for the opening service, there were but 2,000 lay delegates, prebends and bishops in the small auditorium of the convention hall at the final session.

Seeks Militant Discipline

An air of fervor, however, which more than offset the gloom of the day, was seen in the pastoral message, in the address of the Rt. Rev. James DeWolf Peck, today's general convener, and in the pastoral address to his colleagues as he pronounced the benediction.

"There are thousands and thousands of the faithful who by their prayers, by their gifts, by their service, are holding the line," the pastoral said.

"These we think God, but there is a great number of nominal communicants who, enjoying the benefits of the partnership are not sharing its responsibility. We are holding the line," the pastoral said.

Woman Killed, Two Men Hurt In Crash

PAROWAN, Utah, Oct. 23 (AP)—Mrs. Ruth Smith, 20, of Kibbahl, Nebraska, was killed and two men were injured near here today when a motor bus crashed into the rear of a hayrack loaded with seed.

Morris Lyman of Parowan, driver of the team hitched to the seed-laden hayrack, and Ivan Smith of Salt Lake City, operator of the bus, were injured.

The bus was brought to a halt by William Decker of Los Angeles, a passenger, who took control of it when Smith, the driver, was thrown out of the machine.

The accident occurred shortly before daylight today.

A coroner's jury, sitting this afternoon, did not recommend that either Smith or Lyman be held for criminal prosecution, but pointed out that Lyman was driving on the highway without having a light displayed at the rear of his hayrack, as required by state law.

Mrs. Smith's body was hurried from the bus against a post and then fell under the rear wheel of the machine. The head was crushed. She was reported on route from Nebraska to some Pacific coast city where she was to have met her husband. His name was not learned, but he is believed to be in the United States naval service.

HALE CHALLENGES DEFENSE OF BEET ACREAGE TRANSFER

Congressional Candidate Points to Fixed Quotas as Evidence of Attempt to Cut Idaho's Crops

Hobert Q. Hale of Boise, Republican candidate for Second district congressman, in a public address here last evening challenged the assertion that controversy over recently reported transfer of Idaho beet acreage to California is a "political sugar screen," and paid high tribute to Frank L. Stephan of Twin Falls, Republican candidate for governor, whose action in this connection is being most vigorously, Hale sketched the sugar control measure and allotment of a 1,500,000-ton quota of beet sugar to the United States for production and acreage, and continued:
