Senator Borah is right. If the Republican party is ever again to hold the reins of gov-ernment a more liberal policy is essential. The old order of things is ended. For better or worse the American people have adopted a new line of march and it will probably never be possible to return to the old.

But there is a middle course as between extreme conservatism on the one hand and the radical departure from the old methods on the other, and it is along this road that the Republican party must proceed if it is ever again to become a major factor in politics, Senator Borah appears to believe that this is impossible under the old leader-ship and in this, too, Senator Borah is right

There is no leadership in sight today but if conditions warrant it a new leadership will appear. However, if the government continues to command public confidence to the extent that it does today it is con that the Republican party will go the way of the old Whig party, which died chiefly for the reason that it was a party of opposition only and political history proves very clearly that a political party cannot continue to exist upon any such basis alone.

In the meantime partisan opposition to the Rossevelt government merely-because it operates under the banner of the Democratic party won't get anybody anywhere.


