OLD AGE INSURANCE

Undoubtedly, Congress during its next ses-sion will enact some form of legislation providing for old age pensions.

There are a number of reasons for this not the least of which is to be found in the tre-mendous amount of publicity given to the mendous amount of phonesy given to the Sinclair plan of aid for the needy in Cali-fornia, the Utopian programme which emenates from the same state and the legiti-mate demand for some such form of provision for old age which has been under discussion for some years past.

Old age insurance is today pretty well accepted as a necessary concommitant to the intensely competitive programme with which the average man is confronted during his more active years. For a good many years now the State of Idaho has been among those which grant old age pensions under certain restrictions and in Twin Falls county considerable sum per menth is disbursed by the County Commissioners in this way.

However it is anticipated that the Federal plan will be upon a vastly different scale The effort will probably not alone provide against poverty but will be designed to supnly most of the comforts and some of the

ply most of the comtorts and some of the luxuries of modern living.

In order to create a fund for the purpose a tax upon payrolls is proposed which, in the last analysis, means that the insured will provide his own insurance although the employer alone will be taxed. As a matter of fact a good many different plans will prob-ably be considered before a definite programme is decided upon. But by and large, old age pensions or old age insurance, or both, are bound to come. Only if the Federal government is to place a tax upon payrolls the various states should be forever prohib-ited from levying a similar tax. There is altogether too much in the way of duplication of taxes as between the states and the Federal government as it is.



OLD AGE INSURANCE

Undoubtedly, Congress during its next ses-sion-will-enact-some-form-of-legislation-pro-

viding for old age pensions.

There are a number of reasons for this not the least of which is to be found in the tremendous amount of publicity given to the Sinclair plan of aid for the needy in Cali-fornia, the Utopian programme which emenates from the same state and the ignitimate demand for some such form of pro-vision for old age which has been under discussion for some years past.

Old age insurance is today pretty well ac-cepted as a necessary concommitant to the intensely competitive programme with which the average man-is confronted during his more active years. For a good many years now the State of Idaho has been among those which grant old age pensions under certain restrictions and in Twin Falls county a considerable sum per month is disbursed by the County Commissioners in this way.

However it is anticipated that the Federa However it is anticipated that the rederat plan will be upon a vastly different scale. The effort will probably not alone provide against poverty but will be designed to sup-ply-most of the comforts and some of the luxuries of modern living.

In order to create a fund for the purpose a tax upon payrolls is proposed which, in the last analysis, means that the insured will provide his own insurance although the em-ployer alone will be taxed. As a matter of fact a good many different plans will prob considered before a definite gramme is decided upon. But by and large old age pensions or old age insurance, or both, are bound to come. Only if the Federal government is to place a tax upon payrolls the various states should be forever prohibited from levying a similar tax. 
