

### OLD AGE PENSIONS

If the Republican party is to be given a new birth, redressed and rejuvenated, it is altogether likely that one of the features to be incorporated in its platform will be some sort of old age pension law.

Probably a solution of the unemployme oblem if it comes at all will involve a definite plan of payment to those no longer able to earn. Likely such a plan will be based upon the insurance idea, a sort of compulsory saving during the productive years for the establishment of a fund to be drawn against in the later years, with the government sharing in the cost and serving as administrator. Public thought has been pretty we concentrated upon the idea during several years past and the conviction that some such plan is both practicable and necessary has grown steadily.

The popularity of the Sinclair plan in Cal-The popularity of the Sinciair plan in California is directly traceable to the pension idea incorporated in the programme while the growing acceptance of the Townsend plan constitutes a plain endorsement of the basic principles of old age pensions or old age insurance. In the face of this insistent demand it would be strange if action of some sort were not taken. sort were not taken.

If the Republican party seeks a more liberal programme this would be a good place to start. It will not be an easy task to devise a plan sufficiently liberal from the standpoint of the recipient without at the same time constituting an unjust burden upon the class called upon to pay it. Yet it should be possible to work out such a system.

Probably a start will have been made be fore the Republican party finds itself in a position to have anything whatever to say about the matter.

### HORIZONTAL BUILDING

Here is news. A "modern business build ing" is soon to be erected in the heart of Times Square in New York City on the site of a former movie theater. According to the builders' statement it is to be ultra-ultra modern. How many stories? That's the thing that makes it news. The new building will be not more than three stories high.

New York's skyline is a good deal like : ong-range business chart. There are places where it shoots up high to a sharp point, and other places where it drops quite low. It is said that the average height of New l'ork's roofs is about four or five stories up from the street. That height, in these post-boom years, seems more reasonable and useful than the 102 stories of the Empire State Building.

Paris has no skyscraper buildings, but its average roof line is probably quite as high as New York's, because there are so few buildings in that city which fall below the standard French five stories and high mansard roof.

There will doubtless be many low build-Ings built in New York and other cities. One hears more these days about the expense of elevators to rush people to unnecessary heights, and the good sense of having apart-ment buildings with well-lighted, comforthble stairways up which dwellers can walk

There has been a lot of vertical building.
It has been carried to excess in the enthuslastic American way. Perhaps a period of
acrisonal building is at hand.

The Greeks understood gas pressure and made steam engines in the third century B. C. Rome had slot machines in the age of Augustus. Also taximeters for its chariots. Engines of war are very ancient. The Persings 2 400 years ago had revolving knives on their charlot wheels to cut off enemies

Generally speaking, though, the inventive nations never made much practical use of their machinery until the last couple of centuries. They nover put capital to work with machinery for mass production. That's where we surpass them in practical progress, and also in the massed trouble that comes


