WORK AND POVERTY
Father Coughlin, Radio Priest, and Henry Ford agree absolutely on the proposition that to spread work is to spread poverty.

If this be true-a-fundamental principle in

the Government's recovery programme goes into the scrap heap.

Father Coughlin, in a recent newspaper

interview, called attention to the fact that there can be no demand for the product of industry on the part of those who have no purchasing power beyond that required to provide shelter, food and clothing and that without a reawakened demand for the goods turned out by American factories unemployment must continue to grow and more and more men must go into the non-purchasing power group.

Henry Ford expresses the same idea with extensions. Mr. Ford believes that recovery can come about only through high wages and full time employment and that under these conditions the increased purchasing power would constitute about the only factor necessary to bring about nation wide prosperity. frankly admits that this is based upor the capitalistic theory entirely which he de-clares the working man is too wise to destroy for the reason that the working man under the capitalistic system profits to a greater extent than under any other system yet de-

It is all very interesting but even if on agrees with these two men it is a little difficult to see just what else could have been done under the conditions of the past two

It may be that surplus earnings and surplus accumulated through profits are the thing which makes prosperity, in fact it is altogether likely that this is the case, but in the emergency which exists today men who never before accepted or dreamed of, accepting charity have to be fed and the problem which this situation constitutes is not a theory but a fact,

There is a very considerable difference be-tween theory and fact. The Coughlin-Ford theory seems sound enough but the solid fact remains that the required jobs do not exist. When they do there will be no trouble in finding men to fill them, that much at least is

ANOTHER MACHINE GUN

Another of the quiet, cool heroes who fight for law and order in the American war against crime is gone. He is Herman E. Hol-lis, aged thirty, credited with the death of John Dillinger, and slain in turn by the latest Public Enemy Number One, "Baby Face" Nelson, on a highway near Chicago. Another member of this noble little army, Sanfael P. Cowley, chief assistant to Melvin II. Purvis of the federal Department of Justice, was critically wounded and later died.

He added that "a committee of experts will de-cide what industries cost the country more than they yield, and those which must be protected." So there's to be a French "Brain Trust", too!

Evidently the haughty superiority is ebb-ing from foreign minds. European nations, as they find themselves caught in the net of a haffling world depression, come to feel that we Americans, despite our curious eco nomic and political processes, may not be such utter fools after all.

MORE SPENDING AREAD

(Pocatello Tribune)

The winter is again upon us. That the New Deal has not definitely solved the economic problems of the country and taken us out of the depression is triefled by the devertile way in which plans are being drawn for the coming winter.

Just how much money will be appropriated by the next Countries for the PWA, remains to be seen.
