Fire And Cold Take Heavy Toll In U. S.

Several Score of Persons Scumb As Mercury Falls in Many States (By The Associated Press) Fire and cold snuffed out the lives of several score of persons Tuesday as winter laid siege to most of the nation. At Lansing, Michigan, 14 were definitely counted as dead and a number was missing after flames raced through the Kerns hotel. Some of the victims, including several members of the Michigan legislature, perished in the blaze. Others met death when they leaped from flames which demolished a factory there. Another fireman met death and 11 were hurt.

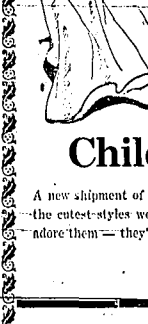
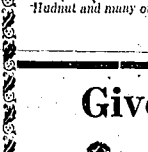

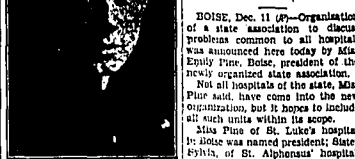

IDAHO'S HOSPITALS FORM ORGANIZATION

Twelve institutions Represented in Movement at Boise Meeting



BOISE, Dec. 11 (AP)—Organization of a state association to discuss problems common to all hospitals was announced here today by Miss Emily Pine, Boise, president of the newly organized state association.

Not all hospitals in the state, Miss Pine said, have come into the new organization, but it hopes to include six such institutions in scope of its work.

Miss Pine of St. Luke's hospital in Boise was named president; Sister Evelyn, of St. Alphonsus hospital, Boise, was named first vice president; Dr. F. M. Cole, Caldwell, second vice president; A. True, Boise, secretary; and William Notstrup, Boise, treasurer.

Hospitals represented at the meeting were two in Boise, two in Hampan, two in Pocatello, Twin Falls, Coaling and Lewiston.

Miss Pine explained Idaho was the only state unorganized so far as hospitals are concerned, and it is the object of the association to remedy this defect.

The report declared "the law as drawn up and presented to the governor stands with only the broad general principles of control, and leaves to the board the matter of specific rules and regulations to carry out the intention of the control act."

In concluding its introductory statement, which immediately preceded the act as proposed in detail, the commission set forth:

1. Making it up to the governor under authority of commission members who have analyzed the laws of other states in the nation, and personally investigated the regulatory programs in states surrounding Idaho, admit that the program for this state will undoubtedly be subject to much criticism from private and selfish interests.

However it is felt that the plan as proposed will meet with the desire of the great majority of citizens of the state and should secure popular acceptance.

2. Equal liability of purchaser and seller of illegal liquor. 3. Liquor advertising is subject to review by the board. 4. Transportation, except in original container, is forbidden.

5. Army of medical, purchaser and seller of illegal liquor. 6. Equal liability of purchaser and seller of illegal liquor. 7. Purchasers must have permits. 8. Liquor advertising is subject to review by the board.

9. Transportation, except in original container, is forbidden. 10. Equal liability of purchaser and seller of illegal liquor. 11. Sales to minors are prohibited.

The commission recommended the appointment of a "director of alcoholic beverage control, and its supervisors to work with local law enforcement officials in the administration of the control act and the rules and regulations of the board.

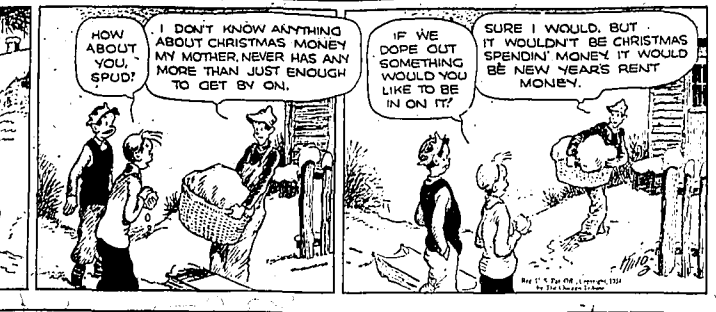

Early returns from the annual Christmas seal sale are particularly gratifying, according to Mrs. H. E. Deas, county mail clerk.

It is the hope of the county that the public shows that the community appreciates the tuberculosis association's vigilance and assumes responsibility in the eradication of tuberculosis, and in this many other health phases it undertakes.

Deposit Box Set Up. "Christmas seals work for you long after the package or letter on which they have been placed is thrown away," Mrs. Orr Chapman, county chairman, points out. "Christmas seals ask little of anyone, but they ask that little of everyone. As a convenience to seal sale supporters, we have placed a receptacle in the Mercile Pharmacy where you may put your return letters, with your contributions. Letters placed here require no postage and are also for sale at this drug store."
