GROWERS ASK U. S. TO REMOVE WHEAT
Spokane Meeting Calls Upon AAA to Fulfill Terms of Farm Act

SPokane, Dec. 13 (AP)—The agricultural adjustment administration yesterday was called upon to comply with the agricultural act by removing 16,000,000 bushels of surplus wheat in the Pacific Northwest.

At a meeting of farmers, millers, dealers and government officials called by the North Pacific Grain Growers, Inc., Dr. George E. Farrell, chief of the wheat section of the AAA, was urged to have the North Pacific Emergency Export association resume operations.

Farrell suggested a solution was that farmers produce less wheat. He said the government probably would move the surplus but he did not indicate that the export association would be brought into use.

"We could find nothing in China we could take in return for American wheat," he said. He predicted foreign markets would be slow in coming back.

Canadian Feed Cheap
Canadian feed for alternate mid-west-cattle-cost-the-farmers 85 cents a bushel, whereas it would have cost \$1.20 a bushel for Pacific Northwest wheat, he said.

"This Northwest surplus is an annual proposition," he said. "Why not give your acres a rest? Your allotment checks are the biggest asset of your farm. Why not take the proceeds and go fishing a week with your family instead of trying to figure what to do with the idle acre."

He said \$1,600,000 in allotment checks would soon be distributed to "William county farmers."

Mrs. W. F. Bling, owner of a Pullou country farm, urged the growers to pin their faith on the Farmers' Union, saying the AAA was leading the farmers into bankruptcy.

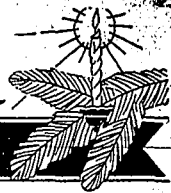

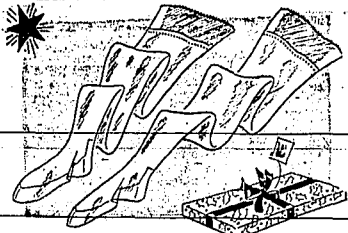

A NEW LIBRARY

A healthy interest is manifested in the proposition to erect a new library building in Twin Falls by means of I.E.R.A. labor and local funds to be used for materials.

But the practicability of the idea can better be judged when detailed estimates of the expense involved can be given to the public.
