The principal eight points of the program are: 1. Creation of a state police department to operate in cooperation with local departments...

2. Franchising of a drivers' license law to promote greater safety throughout the state. 3. Creation of a state radio broadcasting system for use by all police groups...

4. Installation of a teletype system to facilitate dissemination of news and at the same time reduce telephone and telegraph tolls. 5. Free transportation of all officers on duty within the state...

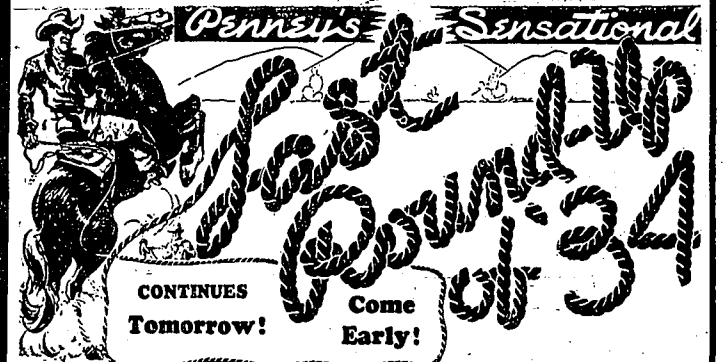
The bodies of all of the accident victims were brought to the Twin Falls mortuary. Arrangements for
