WASHINGTON, N. J., Dec. 29 (AP)—The state of New Jersey has a surprise witness who, an author of a surprise revelation today, will testify he was told on the day of the Lindbergh kidnaping that Bruno Richard Hauptmann had gone to New Jersey and would not be back until late in the night. The witness, the source said, is a resident of the Bronx and a Spanish-American war veteran. He is offered to have held proceedings in the Lindbergh case, but he was not in New Jersey on the day or night of the kidnaping.

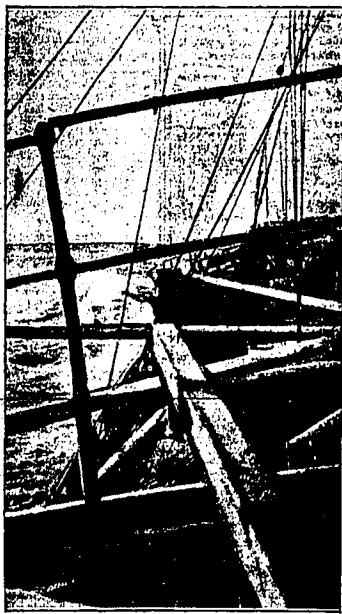




INSTALLATION HELD BY RUPERT MASONS

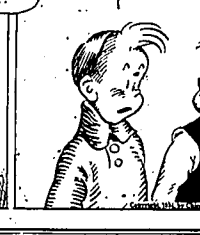

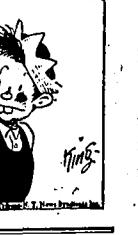
