

MANUFACTURERS' SALES TAX

Among the many plans at Washington for new taxation, to raise money for relief and recovery expenditure, is a sales tax proposed by a member of the House ways and means committee. He wants a levy of 2½ per cent on all manufacturers, to bring in about half a billion a year.

Such a tax seems simpler to levy and collect

than various other forms of taxation. Whether it is wise and expedient is a different ques-tion. Many besides the manufacturers themselves will oppose it.

Moreover, from the standpoint of broad national-policy-gales taxes may well be left to the states, just as income taxes may well be left to Washington, thus making a fair and logical division of tax resources.


