Bolivia's decision to draft all reservists to
the colors in a final effort to end the Chaco war with Paraguay would seem to indicate that she means business and that there is small hope of adjusting the difficulties be-tween the Latin-countries through intervention by the League of Nations. Since the be tion by the League of Nations. Since the be-ginning of the struggle over the disputed territory several frantic appeals have come from Geneva, but the dove of peace found no suitable landing place on the battlefields of South America.

Unquestionably Bolivia's determination to take the latest step was heightened by the take-the latest step was heightened by the accusation of her military leaders that Paraguayan troops had ruthlessly slaughtered wounded enemy soldiers in the Chaco Boreal. If true this wanton cruelty will stand forever as a blot on Paraguay's record for even a thing so grim as war has a code of honor which both-sides-are-expected to

observe.
For small-scale conflicts in history have been more terrible or less understood than the Chaco war. Sanitary conditions are deplarable und at least for a while many of those wounded in battle were inadequately cared for?

As time marches on the world grows weary of this prolonged-engage anitarian reasons. Neither army seems numanitarian reasons. Neither army seems capable of scoring decisive victories in spite of repeated claims and counter claims. The belligerents are apparently no nearer solu-tion of the problem than was the case a number of years ago. Yet the sacrifice of human life goes on day after day.




