

THE GOVERNOR'S MESSAGE

The message of Governor Ross to the third Legislative session may be said about as complete as any document of the kind in the annals of the State.

Very little-detail-accompanies-the-various commendations for legislation although a umber of new-laws are recommended. In the case of the legalization of liquor sales the Governor hands the lawmakers a copy of the report of his special liquor commission but offers no advice as to whether liquor should be sold in State stores or by firms and individuals. Opposition to the return of the valuals. Opposition to the recation and establishment of the system under which liquor shall be sold is left up to the Legis-

ommended, not only as a means of making in the interests of better law enforcement particularly with respect to the curbing of crime of all kinds and especially those crimes having to do with violation of the liquor laws. Passage of a law providing for the issuance of drivers' licenses to all who operate motor vehicles is recommended, this as an added factor of safety in the matter of car operaion throughout the State.

A reduced fee for light car and farmers truck operation is within sight if the gove truck operation is within sight if the gover-nor's recommendation in this respect is fol-lowed. However, it is pointed out that tax income climinated in any quarter may have to be made up in another and the legislature is urged to keep the fact in mind.

The matter of old age pensions in Idaho is declared to have become a burde is rapidly becoming too great for the individual counties and the idea is expressed that the duty of caring for those in need of aid should properly become a function to be shared as between the State and Federal gov ernment. Recommendation as to action nec bring this about is included in the

message.

With respect to the unemployment problem the message contains this paragraph:

"We as representatives of the people must
be concerned with the security of the home. security of employment and the security of old age. We must be concerned with those who have and with those who have not, but our greatest concern must be with those who t, or those who have very little."

Federal public works programmes to be shared in by the various States are referred to as a permanent part of the relief plan of the country and the matter of the securing of an adequate share in the benefits arising from such enterprises is recommended for Legislative attention.

The entire message is comprehensive and all embracing. The continued need of ade-quate educational facilities is tempered with recommendations for economy in the in-terests of State finances and the definite ecommendation is offered that the ad valorem tax for the biennium be not permitted to exceed that of two years ago. Minor fea-tures of State requirements are briefly dealt with the whole constituting a working gramme for the twenty-third Legislative ses

France and Italy took a momentous step
toward the peace of Europe when Foreign
Minister Laval and Premier Mussolini signed
an agreement that increased Italian domination of Colonial Africa and embraced coln for harmony in the ever-danger ous Balkans.

The little states of Central Europa do not in themselves, constitute a grave threat to The real-danger-lies-in-the fact that the larger surrounding nations have adopted a sort of big brother attitude toward them and any friction in the Balkans is quite likely to extend beyond their own borders. This set-up, accentuated by the murder of Archduke Ferdinand in 1914, started the World war and has occasionally in recent years provided continental statesmen with ause-for-alarin

Europe, therefore, breathes easier nov that an understanding has been reache tween two of the powers most affected by Balkan events. Whatever the future brings forth there exists at least a basis for settlement of any disputes that may arise and even the friendly spirit that characterized he Franco-Italian-conversations is a forting sign. Only a few years ago relations between them were not so cordial.

they may seem at the time all movem toward international amity are of more portance than appears on the surface. The world wants peace and the different groups that labor in behalf of a better understanding among nations merit the cooperation of

Time was when war could be limited to the original disputants with little fear of spread. That time has passed. Interests are now so overlapping and closely interwoven that no nation lives to itself. Sooner or later any neutral country is apt to be placed in difficulties which cannot be adjusted without recourse to arms.
