



#### THE SAAR-PLEBISCITE

Frequent minor clashes between Nazi and anti-Nazi factions in the Saar basin as Sunday's momentous plebiscite approaches are manifestations of the mounting political tension there. Feeling against President Adolf Hitler of Germany is apparently quite strong although the fiery leader also has an abundance of supporters in this territory, which has been ur der control of the Lengue

of Nations for many years.

Indications point to the Saar's return to
Germany. Neutral observers forecast an
overwhelming vote in favor of allegiance to the Teuton hanner. The population is largely German and the majority of its interests co incide with those of the Fatherland.

Whatever the outcome of the vote the de will be history making. The city Saarbruccken basks in the rays of a world spotlight that may never be focused there

The Saar has been a disturbing factor in European politics over since the termination of the World war when its destiny was placed in the hands of the League. The plebiscite of January 13 brings matters to a climax with every nation watching interestedly from the sidelines

Regardless of which way the Saar resi-ents turn there seems little likelihood that anything really serious-will-result-although the danger of international complication hatreds are always fraught with a certain amount of peril and Europe has never been entirely free from discord and Suspicion. Stability in the Saar will lift a-heavy-load




