THE VIEWS OF JOHNSON
General Hugh S. Johnson, like a good
many others, is groping. So much is apparent from a reading of his second article on the subject of the N.R.A. in the current issue of the Saturday Evening Post.

The General writes entertainingly of his own views as to the Roosevelt policies but, perhaps wisely, he offers no substitute programme. Nor is his criticism directed against sident Roosevelt *** President Rosevell, and yet "there is something about this depression that doesn't speak well for what we call our common sense." And again, "If we saw a squirrel starving to death in a knothole in his nutfilled hollow tree we wouldn't believe it!"

Undoubtedly General Johnson senses the extent of the problem with which the country confronted and it is apparent that his own ideas of means and methods for the restoration of prosperity in many ways run con-trary to those of President Roosevelt. He believes that curtailment of production is not the way out. Were it possible to obtain proper distribution of the immense stores of goods which the country as a whole possesses, he declares, there would be no limit to our capacity to consume but this he says is Utopia and can never be attained. "But." continues, 'my only point is that all law all administration and all conular effort should be directed toward that goal instead of away from that goal."

General Johnson gives the impress

a puzzled, rather tired man but one with lion. His loyalty to his job as chief of the N.R.A. cannot be doubted even though he failed uttarly in agree with the policies of his loader.

THE PIQUETT DECISION

American law being what it is the Piquett fury had no alternative but to acquit the Dillinger attorney of federal charges alleging conspiracy to harbor the notorious outaw. A verdict announcing that Piquett was

quite within his rights in not surrendering llinger to the authorities was reached swiftly for a case of such magnitude.

In reality the trial involved chiefly a point of law and the outcome was foreshadowed by Federal Judge Holly's instructions to the jury: "When Dillinger escaped and came to Chicago and got in touch with Piquett, it did-not become the duty of the defendant to turn him over to the police." The jurist, of course... was guided in his charge purely by the read-ing of the statute books and the statement was not necessarily in line with his own per-

The case, which constituted another setback for the government in its drive to in-carcorate those accused of sheltering, the outlaw and his henchmen, revives an old; question as to whether lawyers specializing in criminal defense have a moral right to shield fugitives from justice although from a legal standpoint there seems to be no doubt about the matter. Yet Dillinger was almost a gang in himself, a killer whose life had heen one-succession of atrocious murders. Failure to disclose the whereabouts acknowledged culprit would seem to be considerably different than if an individual were only a hunted suspect. However, in the eyes of the law they are in the same category:

Perhaps what is needed is a revision and a stiffening of laws governing such cases. After all anything that menaces public safety as did Dillinger's freedom is of the utmost importance and legal barriers should be removed so that nothing obstructs the protec-tion of American citizens.




