

Moreover not all the necessary funds will continue to come Roosevelt has announced in no uncertain terms that hereafter the various State governments must carry their share of the load and it is proper that they should. But when this ruling goes into effect a revision of exrelief work of all kinds will be pointedly necessary. In the meantime we are confronted; not by a theory but by a fact Idaho's needy must be cared for.






