CONFLICTING TAX LEVIES

Secretary Morgenthau's appointment of of experts to study the problem of conflicting tax levies and report their recor mendations to the national conference Washington in the summer of nineteen-hun-dred thirty-five may be logically interpreted as an attempt to hring order out of chaos in respect of tax matters. present federal state_and_municina

At present teneral, state and municipal governments are engaged in a three-cornered fight to discover and utilize new sources of revenue with each showing little regard for others. Taxpayers can only sit on the n annual total of thirteen billions of dollars ington and a like amount to municipal go ernment. The state receives twenty cents and the balance is divided equally between to specific localities.

Many important sources of revenue have all but disappeared. Particularly is this true with respect to the general property tax. which in sections of some states produced virtually nothing. 


