

At the time the structure was erected payment for crossings presented the only means by which the bridge could be financed. Bonds vere sold, interest to be paid and redemption effected with the money so earned. A fran chise conferring upon the operating company the right to charge such tolls during a period of years was executed and delivered. Today -bondholders own the bridge, at least th bonds constitute a first lien on the property and in the last analysis are the people who will have to be dealt with

If it is possible to finance such means let it be done provided the price d upon is within reason. Expense of maintenance and loss in tax revenue unde public instead of corporate ownership should be far outwelghed by the advantages which from a free-bridge instead of a tol

MIGRATION FOR JOBS

It is estimated that if emigration from Great Britain had continued to the present time at the same rate as before the World War, there would be no unemployment in the British Isles today. In the past few years, owever, more Britons have been returning to the mother country than have left it. In 1931 there was an excess of 37,072 immi-grants over emigrants. Men and women who had gone to other lands to work came home again for the same reason when they lost

But is the employment problem so simple as to be solved by checking immigration? Hardly.

Immigrants all need food and homes and clothing and tools and cars, etc. Their arriv-al in any country ought to increase the de-mand for all these things and consequently Workmen needed That is, it would do so in any country where consumption and production were sanely balanced. There isn't any such country among civilized nations today, it seems.

TEACHING DEMOCRACY

In a recent address Senator Borah express-ed sympathy with "those who are watchful for the spread of Communism and Fascism' in this country. Then he added a wise warning against the use of "Communist or Fascist dealin public officials and private citizens alike, forget that intolerance, suppression and violence are not good American practices. When we employ them against any individual or group or opinion, we betray true Americanism without checking the thing we dislike.

"The best way to deal with either (Communism or Fascism)," Borah says, "is to educate our youth and young people thor-oughly in Americanism."

It is true. Our democracy is based on high nd principles. If we teach our young people what these are and how important is their preservation, there will be little danger of their turning to Communism or Fascism to cure economic or social ilis.




