NO MORE CANCER DANGER

The prevalent impression that there is more danger from cancer than there used to be is wrong, according to Health Commissioner Rice of New York.
True, there are more cases of cancer coming to notice. But this fact is deceptive. Cancer is usually "a disease of later life."
People live longer than they used to. That is, more people grow old. Naturally then cancer cases are more numerous. But the average individual is no more likely to get cancer than his grandfather was.

This is reassuring. There is still more reassurance in Dr. Rice's account of the strenuous, systematic efforts being made in laboratories, clinics and hospitals throughout the world to discover the precise nature and cause of cancer and means of preventing it.
The medical profession will solve this problem, as it has solved so many others which seemed just as baffling.

It works much depends on how good certain Senators are as cross-examiners and how adroit cabinet officers and other officials are as witnesses.

But should the latter school of thought be correct, affairs have reached a stage now where a Presidential veto looks like a highbrowed fence to a lowlander.

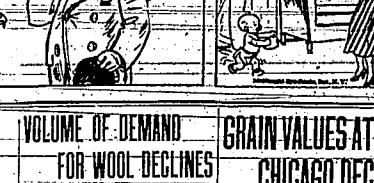
