





What was wrong J. Robert Stoutt, chair-man of the committee, meeting in private sessions, arrived at the following-conclus-

There is little use in talking thrift to

NINE CENTS A DAY Everybody is said to be at work in Japan. That country has prided itself on its apparent exemption from the paralysis afflicting

the rest of the world. If merely having Jobs is the test, the Japanese are a fortunate peo-ple. Their industries are booming. They are capturing world markets.

The picture isn't so bright when you begin looking into wages and living conditions. The pay of industrial and farm workers, always low by American standards, have fallen instend of rising with industrial activity. Of-ficial reports made by the Japanese ministry of agriculture and forestry show that last or agriculture and to easy show that last year male farm-hands, working under yearly contract, averaged thirteen cents a day, and women nine cents. In the silk industry male workers got eighteen to thirty cents a day. and female workers fifteen to eighteen cents, for exacting toll and long hours. Wages in general industry, though higher in many cases, are shockingly low even by European

standards.

It is by such low pay for labor that Japan has been able to undersell western countries in their home and foreign markets. Japanese capitalists and the ruling military class grow strong at the expense of the lower classes. Imperialism so far doesn't seem to have brought much benefit to the people.


