

One phase of the government's social se One phase of the government's social se-curity plan arouses an interesting form of opposition. This is the insurance phase, which has to de chiefly with old age pensions. Insurance companies are said to be criticis-ing government insurance of these types as "an encroachment on their business."

The situation may strike many people as rather curious, when they start looking into it. Our existing insurance companies, while characterized as private enterprise, are per-haps the nearest approach to public enter-prise of all our business institutions. Their capital is small, compared with their vast holdings of money and property. They have been very strictly controlled by law for a general segments, controlled by law for quarter of acceptury. They are generally re-garded, and regard themselves, as trustees of funds belonging to their policy-holders, rather than as profit-sectors. They are more public institutions than private institutions. In short, it might be said that the insurance anies are the people themselves.

If the people now choose to go farther and ke care of certain- forms of insurance. especially old age insurance, directly through the government, there is no apparent reason they shouldn't do so. It isn't as if the government were competing with private en terprise in the steel or automobile business Governments have long performed this ser have long performed this service for their citizens in many other coun-
