During the period from March 15, 1983 to December 31, 1934, the police of Vienna arrested 88,182 persons for political reasons, and searched 106,319 houses. Among those arrested were Nazis, Socialists and Com

There are plenty of things wrong with American politics, but we may be thankful that no government on party over here can go in for wholesale arrests to quell opponents, nor for wholesale and unwarranted housesearching for documents or material which might be used to disadvantage of such op-ponents. Race prejudices and political in-tolerances exist here, unfortunately, but they gorances exist nece, unfortunately, but they are less effective than elsewhere and as far do not endanger the political freedom of any group or individual. They cannot become dangerous while we hold to our freedoms of assembly, speech and press and other constitutional guarantees.

Iowa is not alone in spending generously for cars. The whole country spends for auto-mobiles almost as much as it does for food, more than twice as much as it spends on clothes, nearly four times as much as on housing. That is what it was doing in 1929, and apparently what it still is doing.

There is no reason why people who can use and enjoy them shouldn't have cars if

they can pay for them. But food, clothing and shelter always used to be considered basic needs. In a well-balanced system people nught to be buying more of them, along with autos. It is the current belief that the auto-motive industry will pull us out of this de-pression as it did once before. But isn't it nearly as important to have housing cloth-ing and food receive a big share of the nation's spending?






