

We think we have a lot of radicals in the United States Congress, but they seem mild pared_with_some_of_the_fellows_in British Parliament.

A Labor member from Glasgow rose up
in the House of Commons the other day and
declared right out in meeting that King George and his newly married son and daughter-in-law were parasites, "a part of the parasitical class which is living on the common people of this country with no effort of their own to provide the means of life they enjoy.

He said further that the government was "a gang of national crooks." He added that if the money he expected was going to be spent on the King's silver jubilee, it should be spent "in erecting black flags throughout the length and breadth of the country for a day of national mourning for the common people who are being destroyed by their gov-ernment." For good measure he gave this parting-shot:

"If your class goes to war, you will appeal to the workingmen to help you. And I hope that when that day dawns the workers will use their rifles on the ruling classes."

He got away with it; too. They

They merel ruled him out of order. They have an aston-ishing degree of free speech over there. And it isn't governmental timidity, either. It's policy. They think it's safer to let radicals off steam than to lock them up.

THEATRICAL PROGRESS

Never in theatrical history have screen productions provided such consistently fine entertainment as at present. Standards have risen tremendously and there is every reason to forecast a steady improvement in the years to come:

Not only are the yast majority of pre sentations clean and wholesome with no lessening of story value but there has been a faithful devotion to accurate portrayal of historical and modern life. This has heightened realism, thus increasing enjoyment for audiences.

Discriminating patrons have probably ntributed heavily to this advance by demanding better plots, finer acting and more lavish settings. Only the best offerings bring satisfactory results from a box office standpoint and no picture is released until it is made as nearly perfec as possible.

With movies so popular this uptrend in quality should be welcomed by theatregoers the world over.

GOVERNMENT AND INDUSTRY

The idea of government and industry as friends, rather than enemies, grows a little more familiar. Still, it's surprising to read so strong a statement as this, from William F. Oghurn of the University of Chicago, who handled President Hoover's social trends re

"Industry apparently needs the aid of government," he tells the Afferican Econômic Association, in restraining booms, controlling credit institutions, regulating monopolistic prices of goods which all industries use, preventing unfair competition, aiding foreign trade, planning and carrying out-plans for which all industries use, preventing un-fair competition, adding foreign trade, planning and carrying out-plans for greater efficiency between different in-dustries, helping to smooth out mal-adjustments due to invention and science as in the case of transportation and-communication, and in adjusting industry to the mobility or immobility of popula-tion as in the case of agriculture."




