Federal bonds containing the gold clause are payable in gold all right but there is no way for the bond holder to make collection. This seems to be the gist of the Supreme Court decision in so far as it applies to governmant bonds.

Private bonds, that is to eay all bonds oth er than Federal bonds, are worth whatever their face value amounts to, subject to the vagarles of the bond market. And they are not payable in gold whether they contain the called "gold-clause" or not.

In the words of Justice McReynolds, a ma jority of the Court ruled that Congress lacked power to repudiate its gold obligation but that it could not be compelled to currency the value of the gold called for

It is too early yet to reach a conclusion as nancial fabric of the country. It is quite pos-sible that there will be no visible effect whatever. But a new principle in the field of fi-nance has been laid down and changes are und to eventually ensue.


