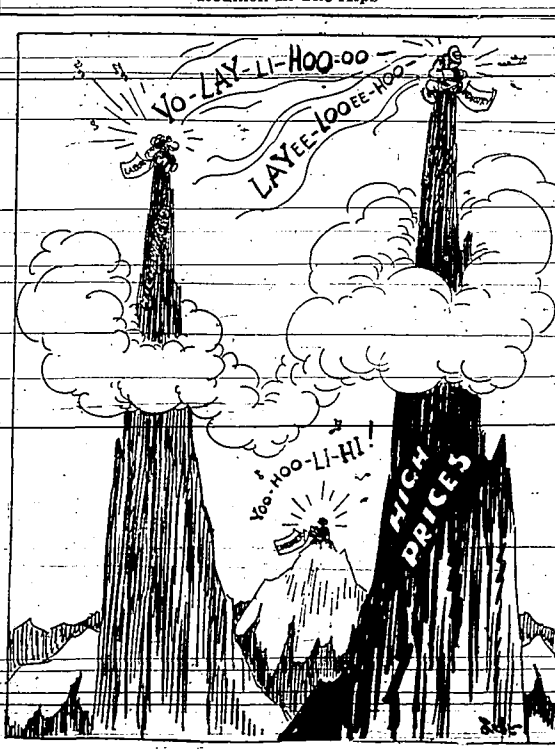

(By The Associated Press) BOISE, Feb. 21.—By a 17-27 vote the Idaho senate today defeated a measure to consolidate present executive departments of the state.

Earlier in the day a bill by Senator Pomart, D-Boise, to consolidate the executive departments of state to reduce the number from 17 to 10, was defeated in the senate.

While the senate was doing that the house passed the death knell for house bill 16, the bill drawn by the governor's advisory committee on liquor control.

Representative Sharp (D-Ada) had earlier moved and his motion was carried by a 21-17 vote.

Representative Sharp said that he would take a majority to get the bill out of the legislature.

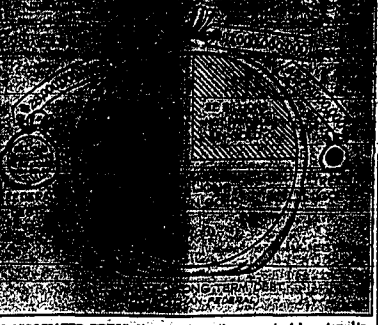

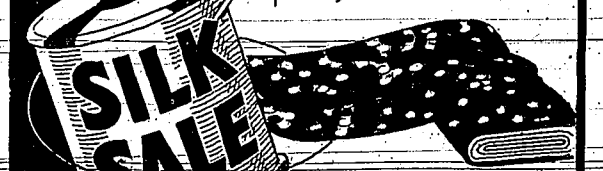

BELAMY'S PROPHECIES

Mrs. Edward Bellamy, widow of the famous author of "Looking Backward," talked interestingly the other day of prophecies made by him over forty years ago.

The prophecies in which the public is most interested today, however, are the social and economic inventions forecast in "Looking Backward" and "Equality."

Bellamy, his wife explains, was not a revolutionist but an evolutionist.

He loved the United States with all his heart, and he firmly believed that his plan of economic equality was in thorough keeping with the principles outlined in the Declaration of Independence and the Preamble of the Constitution.

Today we would probably call him a Socialist. He bore no resemblance, though, to the violent brands of that faith we see in some parts of the world.

A WAY OUT

The bill introduced in the lower house of the Idaho Legislature by Dan J. If we are more financially inclined than Europe perhaps that fact explains why American living standards by and large are much higher than those abroad where class distinctions are often more sharply drawn and where peasantry and aristocracy are things definitely apart.

This situation contrasts unfavorably with ours and there is considerable gratification in the fact that America, even in depression days, is still the greatest land of opportunity on the face of the globe.

PRODUCTION GOES UP

Underneath all the much-discussed subdivision of the recent season's crop and the fact that it will take 450 days to move forward properly, the United States Chamber of Commerce reports that industrial production at the end of 1934 was 25 per cent above the low point of 1932, and that 1,200,000 more wage earners were on the payroll of manufacturing plants than was the case two years ago.

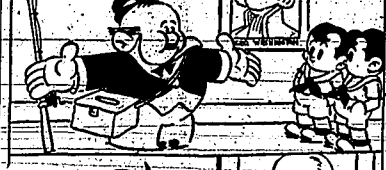

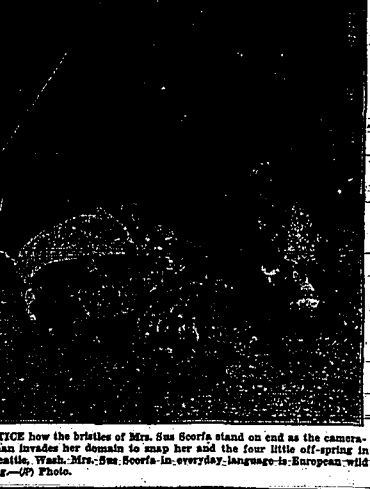

**GAG SLAPPED ON BONUS PETITION**

Protests Bring Modification of Secorey Order Invoked in House

WASHINGTON, Feb. 21 (AP)—A new, stringent secrecy order was invoked, criticized and promptly liberalized today by house leaders as backers of the \$2,000,000 Patman bonus pay-off bill moved to assure consideration of the measure.

Patman emphasized that he intended "no criticism" of the ways and means committee, before which his bill is pending.

Leahy (D-N.Y.) seconded and Representative Cannon (D-Mo) thirded. Senate Republicans, Conservatives and all three Farm-Labor members signed.

Leahy, meanwhile, continued their "hands-off" policy, declining to take sides in the dispute between advocates of the Patman and the American Legion bills. The former would pay the bill by issuing new currency, the latter would merely authorize an appropriation.

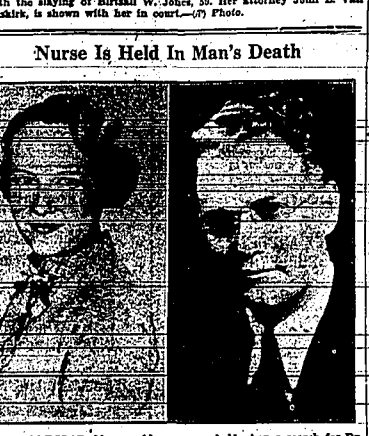

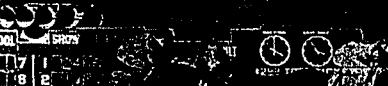

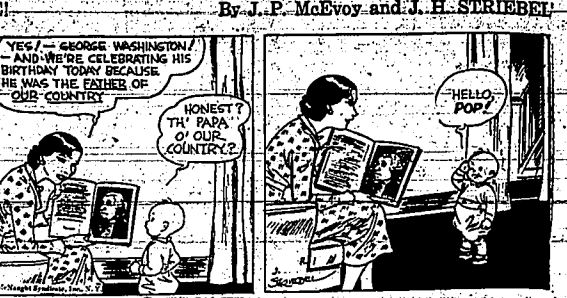
