### THE DRIVER'S LICENSE LAW

It is difficult to say at this time who henefits if any will accrue from the establishment of a driver's license law in Idaho Sponsors of the legislation of course hope ill reduce the number of accidents by deators to handle cars. An examination is to be given each applicant and whether or not he receives a permit is at the discretion of officials. Just how high a grade he must receive in order to pass the test has never been publicly stated.

No doubt something should be done to make the streets and highways safer and any move with this in view deserves serious conadderation. Accidents increased sharply in nineteen hundred thirty four and there were numerous fatalities. At present some thirty possess such a driver's law. Quite pos-its operation in Idaho will eliminate individuals who are definitely incompetent to use the arteries of travel, thus making them safer for the majority.

## THE DOOMED ELMS

The federal government is fighting the American elm blight harder than ever. The battle now spreads over 5,000 square miles in New York, Connecticut and New Jersey. Nearly 100 crews are at work. They have already chopped down about 40,000 infected known to be dead or dying. The trees have to be completely destroyed by fire.

It is doubtful whether these strenuous efforts, supplemented by those of states, cities and private individuals, can stop the ravages of this Dutch blight. It has penetrated already into the middle west. It may sweep the country, and the best-loved of our native trees may go the way of the American chest nut. As in the case of the chestnut, new trees may continue to spring up for years, appar ently sound, but withering after a few years

If the present war is lost, it might be pos sible to restore these two species again with healthy specimens from abroad after they disease assailing them has been starved out. For the present, the sensible thing is to des-troy completely and immediately every tree that shows signs of the disease.






