

Germany must be in a worse way finan-cially than the world has suspected. Hitler has Issued an order for governmental con-scription of cash, as a Berlin dispatch explains, "to buy raw materials and consoll-date debts." The hunt has already begun.

The Nazi-minister-of-finance-has-broad

powers. He may strip liquid assets from all who have them, whether individuals or business firms. It is even said that he may get after Germans who have securities and bank accounts abroad. All foreign holdings must he registered at the Reichsbank, so that the government will know where they are.

This is not outright confiscation. At least

not yet. The money and other liquid assets presumably will be regarded as loops or paid for in government bonds or reichsmarks. There will be some question, though, as to what the government paper is worth. And German business will be greatly handi-






