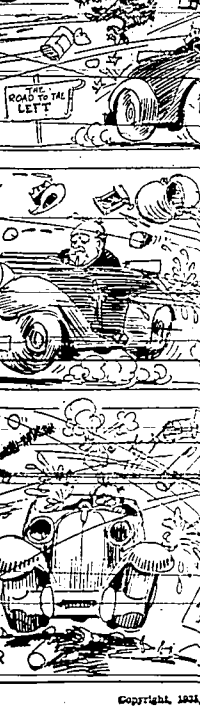

### BRIDGE SUIT GOES TO FEDERAL COURT

Judge A. B. Barclay Orders Removal to Avoid Continuing Question

Judge Adam B. Barclay in the district court here yesterday ordered removal to the United States district court of a suit filed by Roy McDonald, motor stage operator, instituted recently to prevent the Twin Falls Economic Development Bridge company of Seattle, from collecting tolls at the rim-to-rim bridge constructed in 1932 to span Snake river canyon on highway route 69, northeast of Twin Falls.

The bridge company sought removal of the case to the federal court and alleged that the name of an employee, E. R. Sherman, former Twin Falls county sheriff, had been listed as a defendant for the purpose only of bringing the action in the state court.

Ordering the removal of the case, Judge Barclay, in a letter addressed to Turner G. Hackman, attorney for the state contractor, and to Eugene L. Stephan and J. H. Blamford, attorneys for the bridge company, said:

"The question of whether or not this case should be removed to the federal court always has been open to me unless an objection is filed by that court. As I understand the matter, this could never be done by application for an injunction in the federal court. The suspension procedure here until the question had been determined by that court. Therefore, in order to order the removal and have the federal court say whether it should be remanded or whether it will retain jurisdiction."
